FEATHERS IN THE WIND

I've never said that I'm not gullible, but lately things have made me quite the opposite. Quite frankly it disturbs me even more do because of books and teaching materials being taken away from people in certain states.

When you get right down to it we have been fed lies by politicians for years and yet chose to re-elect them time and again into office.



If you plan to run a retail business out of the home you live in, you will need a Home Occupation permit. This is all nicely detailed in Ordinance 31.02.050(I) which can be found at the ACLUD website (see below). Once obtained, these permits are good for five years. The overall intent here is to maintain the character of both the surrounding neighborhood and the home.
