¹² Now we ask you, brothers and sisters, to acknowledge those who work hard among you, who care for you in the Lord and who admonish you. ¹³ Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work. Live in peace with each other. ¹⁴ And we urge you, brothers and sisters, warn those who are idle and disruptive, encourage the disheartened, help the weak, be patient with everyone. ¹⁵ Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for



wrong, but always strive to do what is good for each other and for everyone else.

¹⁶ Rejoice always, ¹⁷ pray continually, ¹⁸ give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. 1 Thessalonians 5:12-18

First Thessalonians is believed to be the oldest book in the New Testament and written by Paul to this group who believed the return of Jesus would happen during their lifetime. As we work differently, I remind you of a couple of events: Drive In Communion on the 1st and 3rd Sundays. Zoom Sunday School on 2nd and 4th Sundays. Zoom: Coffee, Food, and Fellowship on 5th Sundays.

Students are asked to bring their backpacks to Drive In Communion during September for a blessing. We are all encouraged to bring school supplies for students in the community. You may drop them off in the office or bring them to Drive In Communion on September $6^{\rm th}$.

As you can tell, we are not waiting idly, as the community of disciples at Mt. Hermon, we are working as we wait!

Congregational Council Mini Minutes July 12, 2020 via Zoom

ATTENDANCE: All were present with the exception of Joe Koon and Mitch Stevens

CARES AND CONCERNS: Praying for family of Wayne Stoddard (Diane Boulware's uncle who passed away), family of Connie Bucknam after her passing, David Hydrick (Buddy Hydrick's cousin) who had a stroke, and Gene Schofield who is slowly healing at home.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA: Approved with addition of line item for discussion of time of future council meetings

ADOPTION OF MINUTES: The minutes from June 14, 2020 meeting were approved with corrections **REPORTS:**

- Pastor Gina: Written report received. 90 Day Devotion Challenge books available in church office
- Treasurer: Written report received for June 2020. Offering collected through June 30, 2020, in Current and Benevolence Fund is \$116,892.15 with expenditures of \$110,034 for the same time period.
- Financial Secretary: Written Report received for June 2020, second quarter 2020, and first two quarters together of 2020. Request from member for Annette to let members know when their Thrivent distributions have been sent to the church. Request from member that congregation would like to know amount collected for Mother's Day Bulletin (\$985) and Father's Day Bulletin (\$1050).

Team Reports/Recommendations:

- 1. Worship: Live Stream donations to the project total \$4000 thus far. Wires are being pulled in the church for new video/audio system. Cameras are ordered for Live Streaming. Ruthie has asked council's permission to possibly move dates of Live Streaming Concert due to various artists trying to get together. The concert may also occur over two days. She will update church in time for everyone to watch. APPROVED
- 2. Teach: Question from council member if there will be online VBS or Sunday School. Alyson Price says the committee hasn't met recently but she will reach out to Daryl Leigh Anthony.
- 3. Support: Finance Committee to meet in the future
- 4. Outreach: Food Pantry recipients continue to request face masks. Little Library is fully stocked but don't have usage information.

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. Cross on top of church: Cross still needs to be repaired on top of church steeple. Earl Sease has contacted the closest person known to do this work in Greensboro, North Carolina. He hasn't traveled here to assess damage due to COVID. The cross still remains lit even though it's broken so that will need to addressed if it can remain lit when repaired.
- 2. Church office: Hours back to normal Monday-Friday 9 am to 1 pm
- 3. SC Synod Convention: Will occur virtually on 7-25-20 and anyone can watch at home with election of new bishop to occur. Mt. Hermon can have one male and one female delegate to vote. Council recommends that Terry Swygert and Diane Boulware represent Mt. Hermon. **APPROVED**

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Task Force for reopening church: Wynne Price will chair with members who have volunteered—Dr. Carl Kinard, Myra Kinard, Marion Leaphart, and Devona Price to study reopening plans and logistics. Council tables discussion about reopening church for now.
- 2. Future meeting times: Motion to change council meetings to second Sunday of each month at 6pm unless there is a time change requested by a council member. If Ruthie has her concert on the second Sunday of August we will meet on the third Sunday at 6pm. **APPROVED**

Called Congregational Council Meeting Minutes August 2, 2020 via Zoom

ATTENDANCE: All were present with the exception of Jenny Scott **MEETING PURPOSE:** Discuss recommendations from Health and Safety Task Force Meeting

Recommendation #1: The food pantry delivery to be made through the door in the education wing closest to the bus shed.

• Discussion: We need to decrease foot traffic through the church office area. If recommendation is to receive and distribute food to food pantry clients at the end of the education wing, shouldn't we move the food pantry itself to end of Sunday School hall? A battery operated doorbell camera has been donated that could be installed on door for viewing of clients in blind spots and for safety. Lutheran Men would volunteer to build shelves for food storage in new location. Motion by council to move food pantry to the last Sunday School room on the right side of the education wing, install a battery operated doorbell camera on outside door, build shelving, and deliveries to be made through the door in education wing closest to the bus shed. **APPROVED**

Recommendation #2: The kitchen, fellowship hall, and the basement of the sanctuary to be sanitized and secured to prevent entry into those spaces. With the exception of the food pantry, the only entry and exit will be through the doors outside of the church office. Signs will be posted at secured entrances to direct people to the church office for entry into these areas, if absolutely necessary.

• Discussion: Recommend sign in sheet of who comes into secured area with the time frame listed and where they go in the church. This will help us know what areas to sanitize if someone tests COVID positive. Ricky Bouknight and Terry Swygert will continue to walk thru these areas one to two times per week to insure there are no leaks or other maintenance issues to be addressed. Toilets will also be flushed and water used out of fountains to keep them from acquiring disease from non usage. A letter will be created and mailed to congregation to explain these recommendations. Motion by council to approve recommendation #2 with additional language: "Sign in sheets" will be provided in church office to keep a record of who enters, where they go in church, and how long they are in that area. This will only be used in the event a member who has accessed the church tests COVID positive and we need to initiate contact tracing purposes and sanitization." **APPROVED**






Outreach Happenings...


