At its July meeting, the Church Council voted to "try on" one Sunday service for the fall. Starting Sunday, September 8th our Sunday worship service will move from 9 am (Summer hours) to 10 am for September, October, and November. Sunday School will begin at 8:45 am and dismiss at 9:45 am. After experiencing this trial for a couple of months, a more permanent worship time or times will be discussed at the congregational meeting in November. Following conversation at the congregational meeting, the plan is for the council to meet November 20th to set a more permanent time starting the 1st Sunday in Advent, December 1, 2019. We could remain at the same worship time. change the worship time, or go back to 2 services on a Sunday. All options remain open. In a survey last year, the great majority supported one service, and yet there are many questions. Perhaps "trying it on" will bring more clarity to the questions and fears. The Saturday service at 5 pm will remain the same.

Dear Folks,

Recently, due to some sleepless nights caused by my Lyme's Disease, I had some rather long conversations with God. I say conversations, but I have to admit, at times I felt more like Jacob wrestling with God through the night ending up with a hip out of joint. At one time or other, we all face such struggles and conversations. Mine was borne out of pain and uncertainty, but it can be concern for a family member or relationship, a medical issue, or even a problem at work.

For people of faith, we turn to prayer and conversation with God because we believe in the struggle there is still hope. We believe that God can shine a light that no darkness can overcome. We believe that we are not alone, but God is present with us, even in the most troubling of times, offering abundant mercy and grace.

In those dark struggles, or even in everyday life, such hope does not magically appear. It is the result of the Holy Spirit working in and through us in our practice of faith. For me it was years of attending Sunday School and sitting in the 5th pew from the front with my family for worship every Sunday. It was my Aunt Frances singing "Jesus Love Me" to me over and over again. And now it's being part of this congregation where I am blessed to see God working through this community of people in various ways to share the good news of the gospel.

God through Jesus Christ calls us to live a life in him. Our faith is built up by the Holy Spirit as we practice. In our baptism we are called "to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and dead, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth. (Affirmation of Baptism, ELW p. 236)

In the world of gymnastics, Simone Biles just completed some history making moves, never before done in competition. These unprecedented moves did not come without practice. Although she has been blessed with a God given talent that she has honed to become the top in her class, she still needs practice.

No matter how many years you've worshipped, attended Sunday School, prayed, read scripture, or volunteered for anything in the church, God through the Holy Spirit still calls you to practice your faith. We are shortchanging ourselves, our children, and our grandchildren if we don't practice and share this God given faith.

Let's not miss the wonder and amazement of taking the time to see how God is working in our lives and the world. The Holy Spirit is God's gift to guide us in practicing our faith. Let us be living and growing witnesses to the love of God in this world.

Starting September 8th our Sunday School for all ages will resume at 8:45 am with Worship at 10 am. Come sing your praise for God's abundant blessings. Come practice your faith, hearing God's word for you. Come to share and witness to your faith in Christ Jesus. Let us bear the light and hope of God's love into a world that at times can appear so dark.

SUNDAY SCHOOL CALLS YOU!
