

REFLECTIONS

STOP and LISTEN - FOR YOU NEVER KNOW WHAT SIGN YOU WILL RECEIVE

Today's reading reminds me of when I was first approached about being a Supervisor. The company I work for hired a large number of employees and was looking for veteran workers to mentor the new workers and or be promoted to supervisor. My initial response was I would mentor, but I did not want the responsibility that goes along with being a supervisor. I can be accountable for myself, but I did not want the responsibility or liability of being responsible and accountable for others. I was approached a second time, this time I listened to their pitch of how they believed that my knowledge and experience was what they wanted and needed to lead the new employees. My response was I would think about it. In my thinking about the responsibility and liability, I also prayed about my decision. One morning while riding the elevator with a young man, in a general conversation, I commented about the beauty of the day, and enjoying the morning drive, spring flowers, and how it was going to be a good day. His response was "You'll make a great supervisor". Now he had no knowledge of my being approached or being considered for supervisor. While I simply replied thank you, I walked away asking myself if this was a sign, is this the answer to my prayer? Well, I accepted the promotion not wanting to question the sign of how my decision affected and benefitted others.

In the first reading, the Lord said through the Prophet Isaiah, "Ask for a sign from the Lord your God". But Ahaz did not want to ask as he did not want to tempt the Lord. The Prophet Isiah responded "Listen, it is not enough to weary (wear out) people, must you weary my God? Therefore the Lord himself will give you this sign: the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel." In the Gospel, Matthew 1:18-24, Joseph receives a sign when an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him JESUS, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: Behold the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel."

During this season of ADVENT, as we prepare for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ through prayer, Stop and Listen, for we know not what sign He will send to answer our prayers.

Know Your Faith

The Date of Christ's Birth

The first Christmas was said to have been celebrated 1700 years ago. This indicated that Christmas was not celebrated until around the fourth century after the death of Christ. That notwithstanding, we ask the question: Is December 25 the actual date of Christ's birth? There are several arguments against December 25 being the actual date of Christ's birth. Some Christians in fact refuse to celebrate Christmas or December 25 for these reasons, among all others, that the date has no biblical record, and that it relates to a pagan day celebration of the sun-god. Undoubtedly, there is no mention or reference to December 25 in the Bible. History noted that not even among the early Christians up to the fourth century was the birthday of Jesus Christ mentioned or celebrated.

However, should these historical facts necessarily stop us from celebrating the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ? An attempt to understand the meaning of Christ's birth and its celebration at Christmas will help to clarify some of these misinterpretations. The birth of Christ climaxed the history of our salvation. Thus it is absolutely appropriate and necessary that we call to mind the mystery of our salvation and celebrate it, even far and above every other blessing we can imagine. With regards to the date, December 25, is it not fitting that the celebration of a pagan sun-god, a non-entity, whose worship consumed the entire world at that time, be baptized into a Christian celebration? St Paul made it clear to the people of Athens, who had built a shrine for an un-known god that he knew and preached about that God who was un-known to them. It is equally arguable that those who worshipped the pagan sun-god were doing so in ignorance of the real Sun of Justice, Christ the Lord. It thus behooves Christianity to tell the whole world of the real Sun of Justice, the Son of God, by celebrating his birth in place of the pagan sun-god celebration, even though the date of Christ's birth is historically unknown.

Baptism


Parents desiring baptism for their children are encouraged to contact the pastor at least two weeks in advance to arrange for the required preparation class for parents and godparents.
