

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

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TOWN OF KREMMLING  
REGULAR RESCHEDULED TOWN BOARD MEETING  
August 15, 2017

The Board of Trustees, for the Town of Kremmling, met in the boardroom located at 200 Eagle Avenue. Mayor Thomas Clark called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Trustees present: Scott Crandall, Gina Schroeder, Wes Howell, Guy Bakke, and Grace Bohall. Staff present: Town Manager Mark Campbell, Police Chief Scott Spade, Public Works Director Jason Bock, and Town Clerk Rhonda Shearer.

HOWELL MOVED TO APPROVE THE REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING MINUTES OF AUGUST 2, 2017. SCHROEDER SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

BAKKE MOVED TO APPROVE THE ACCOUNTS PAYABLE FROM AUGUST 3, 2017 THROUGH AUGUST 15, 2017 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$54,407.17. SCHROEDER SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

SCHROEDER MOVED TO APPROVE THE AGENDA. BOHALL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

Shelly McManus, representing the Chamber of Commerce, asked the board if they had issues with youth aged 15-17, volunteering to run the gates at the demolition derby. Chief Spade had no issues with them volunteering. The Board also had no issues. She also asked if the volunteers running the beer sales at the domination derby could wear t-shirts, that advertise the derby and will also be for sale, rather than the bright yellow staff t-shirts. The majority of the board had no issues with the volunteers wearing the different shirts.

Mayor Clark also noted that the chamber would like to apply for a grant from Freeport McMoran, for a new sign for the front of the chamber. The chamber is a 501(c)(6), and Freeport requires the applicant to be a 501(c)(3). It was suggested that the chamber approach the West Grand Education Foundation to see if they would be willing to run the grant through them.

Manager Campbell gave the board a synopsis of Resolution 2017-08-01, which calls for a special election on November 7, 2017, and deals with Senate Bill 152.

BAKKE MOVED TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 2017-08-01. CRANDALL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

The board discussed two draft ordinances regarding UTV use. There were a few minor changes made, and the board agreed to send them to the attorney to draft as final ordinances.

The Mayor reported:

- He and Manager Campbell attended a Utility Coordinating Council meeting and a Mayor, Manager, Commissioners meeting.

The Police Chief reported:

- The annual county fair went well with no major issues.
- There will be four county sheriff's deputies here for the demolition derby this weekend.
- They are still seeing a higher caseload this year, close to the double that of previous years.

The Public Works Director reported:

- The water plant is running good.
- They are getting their equipment ready for the winter season.
- They electric line at the town shop/police department has been replaced.

The Town Manager had no report.

Mayor Clark introduced County Commissioner Richard Cimino to the board.
