I have been slowly cleaning out the Pastor's Study, going through files and consolidating things, organizing book shelves and rearranging the furniture, I found a little booklet that Rev. Mark Phillips wrote in 2003 for the 140th anniversary of the church. It was an absolute delight to discover it, and I thoroughly enjoyed reading about the history of the church. I know that often history is boring. We have to remember names and dates, war and the resulting treaties. I think that's a little boring too. History to me is the little stories, all the little ordinary moments that make us human and remind us that we're connected across time.

The little booklet shares stories about the fire in 1883 in the place where church records were kept, which led to incomplete records though the Session later compiled things from memory to provide at least something. I learned about the early iterations of our women's groups, and the creation and eventual dissolution of our choir. However, my favorite story was that of J.B Lane as told by previous pastor Rev. Cal Martin. As a youth, J.B Lane strayed from the worship service and decided to go play in a mine shaft. He could hear the congregation singing and worshipping from his playground deep in the earth. I can only imagine the wonder and probably a bit ethereal-ness (and maybe a little spookiness) that J.B Lane experienced that day.

On the second to last page is a list of all our ministers, starting with Rev. J.H. Scott in 1862. I consider it an absolute honor to follow in the footsteps of all the ministers that came before me. First Presbyterian Church has had a long, wonderful history, and I'm excited to be a part of its future.

We are now looking towards our 160th anniversary in 2023. We want to mark it's passing with a celebration. If you're interested in helping us plan something, please get in touch with me! Once we have a number of people, we'll find times for us to meet and plan.


