


the complex connection between horses and humans and its deeper meaning with breathtaking footage taken from across the Midwest.

John Sears, aka Mule, has been roaming the western United States with his three mules for over thirty years. The 68-year-old and his animals sleep outside, insisting on their right to move freely. Bemoaning the loss of open space, the ever-increasing urban sprawl and our dependence on the automobile, Mule advocates a simpler way of life in harmony with nature. While many appreciate his nomadic lifestyle, Mule is not welcomed

everywhere. Confrontations with law enforcement have resulted in fines, arrests, even institutionalization. This documentary takes an intimate look at Mule's unique experience and his urgent message for contemporary American society.

Twenty-two US veterans commit suicide every day. At over 8,000 a year, this is four times greater than the casualties assumed in the War in Afghanistan. And that doesn't account for the 1 in 5 veterans diagnosed with PTSD, depression or other psychological disabilities. These men and women are suffering, and in some cases, killing themselves on the very soil they offered their life to protect. Why? If you ask ex-Navy SEAL Micah Fink, he will tell you it's because the current "treatment" these men and women are receiving

isn't working. He's says veterans don't have a disease.

That's why Fink started Heroes and Horses. A program that pushes vets to reintegrate into society in a way that is fundamentally different from current treatments. No therapists, no medication, and no telling them how they should feel or what normal looks like. Instead of numbing the challenges they face, Fink takes them deep into the wilderness- the heart the country they fought for - where they confront those challenges head on.

My professional career began with the study of preverbal interactions between infants and adults at the Collège de France in Paris. In my work today, I continue to draw on this experience based on observation in order to convey the emotional power of horses.

From 2009 to 2013, I photographed Lusitano horses, approaching them in a way that was in tune with their lives, remaining as unobtrusive as possible. I paid close attention to their daily activities and the constant mutual adjustments observed between the horse and horseman. I tried to translate through images the sense of wonder and unsettling emotions they evoke in me.



STALLION OF A DREAM: California and the Camarillo White Horse is the quintessential California story. From the 19th Century, Californians have sought a slicker means of locomotion, but before lowriders, hotrods and freeways, California was the birthplace of an endangered rare horse breed that set it apart: The Camarillo White Horse. For a century, these horses have embodied the California dream to spectators worldwide, evoking California's storied past of immigration and empire-building and illuminating shifting attitudes on race, social status and personal identity. Into the cauldron of desire, possibility and the alchemy of transformation that was

early California, came the aristocratic Spanish colonists known as the Californios, among them the Camarillo family. In this early California landscape the horse was central to traditions and culture.

reason. He is training Sunshine Numbers, a nine year-old thoroughbred, for his first steeplechase of the season Saturday. Kingsley and Sunshine Numbers developed a special relationship during the six years they have worked together. "My relationship with him is to figure out what makes him happy and help him to understand what I need from him and we meet somewhere in the middle," said Kingsley. Kingsley says the thoroughbred lets him know what he's thinking. "Sunshine Numbers is very particular and opinionated horse. He doesn't make any mistake about what's on his mind," he said. Known as "The Dude" by most everyone at the stables, Sunshine Numbers is an exceptional racehorse. He won seven out of the last 18 races he competed in. Kingsley says that's an extraordinary record.
