Faith

I wonder if the disciples were at all like us, or we are at all like them, when we think of faith as a quantityrelated item. "I have more faith than he does" is a statement that quantifies the whole concept of faith. "I need more faith" is a sentence that often comes off of our lips.

What if it mean something other than

you could quantify? In our Gospel this morning Jesus is suggesting, at least it appears to me He is suggesting, that faith is something we do. It denotes action, and not quantity, unless we count our actions and re-actions to the Son of God.

Could that give us a different view of the concept of faith? Jesus likens faith to the servant just doing their job. It is in the "doing" of the task, and not anything else. Jesus is leading the disciples into an entirely new direction. Little wonder these 12 guys were always confused.

I think Jesus is telling the disciples they have everything they need to get the job done. It doesn't take a lot of work accumulating faith. What might take work is to respond to the God-given opportunities which we find in front of us. If the disciples have everything they need, we too can celebrate that gift of faith. And perhaps it is our time to begin to use faith in just such a manner.

Look at what opportunities lie in your path. What does God want you to do? What steps is He hoping you will take to be able to move toward His divine future for you? It is up to us to engage. Just step into it and see where God leads you! It is a process filled with adventure! God does not disappoint!

We need to think if we are making the same mistake the disciples made-waiting for the right quantity of faith. Jesus makes it plain- it does not take much, just to step out and get the job going! With God's help, our days find order and grace as we exercise that faith!

FIRST LESSON: Lamentations 1:1-6 New International Version (NIV)

How deserted lies the city, once so full of people! How like a widow is she, who once was great among the nations! She who was queen among the provinces has now become a slave. Bitterly she weeps at night, tears are on her cheeks. Among all her lovers there is no one to comfort her. All her friends have betrayed her; they have become her enemies.

After affliction and harsh labor, Judah has gone into exile. She dwells among the nations; she finds no resting place. All who pursue her have overtaken her in the midst of her distress. The roads to Zion mourn, for no one comes to her appointed festivals. All her gateways are desolate, her priests groan, her young women grieve, and she is in bitter anguish.

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, in keeping with the promise of life that is in Christ Jesus, To Timothy, my dear son: Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

I thank God, whom I serve, as my ancestors did, with a clear conscience, as night and day I constantly remember you in my prayers. Recalling your tears, I long to see you, so that I may be filled with joy I am reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also.

For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline. So do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner.
