

The Caddo Lake National Wildlife Refuge An 8,493-acre protected area of Texas managed b

Wildlife Service as part of the National Wildlife Refuge System. It is located along Caddo Lake in East Texas. There is a six-mile-long driving trail offering native grasses, birdhouses, feeders, duck boxes and bat houses/nurseries. There are many wildlife observation areas on the refuge. Over 216 recorded resident and migratory bird species.

You are welcome to enjoy the many open paved and gravel roads within the refuge as they are great for wildlife watching and hiking. An old railroad right-of-way is today a 9-mile nature trail. In addition to the Wildlife Observation Trail, several shorter trails are available for your enjoyment.

Free of charge, seven days a week from sunrise to sunset.

Come prepared! Mosquitoes and deer flies can be abundant, so insect repellent is recommended.

Be on the look-out for poison ivy.

November - Travel Photography:

A photograph taken while traveling. It can include people (who should not be recognizable to the club) but must include a place that is not found around here. It can be building(s), nature, or other suitable content that says "I was here". Color or B&W. Taken after November 1, 2018.

2020 Assignments

January - Backyard Birds: You don't have to travel to capture birds. Your backyard or a neighborhood park provides plenty of opportunities to photograph birds. Check out Dolph McCranie's article in the February 2019 ASC newsletter on photographing backyard birds. Color or Black and white.

March - Bugs: Interesting insects. These can be taken anywhere, but must be taken after March 1, 2019. Color or B&W.

May - Black & White Landscape Black & White Landscape - Any landscape, taken anywhere, but must be taken after May 1, 2019.

July - Leading Lines: Photograph anything you want, but the photograph must include lines that lead your eye to the subject. Color or B&W, but must be taken after July 1, 2019.

September - Diners, Drive-Ins & Dives: If you've seen the series on the Food Network, you know what we're looking for. Cafes, dance halls, beer joints, and the like are all eligible. Color or B&W. Must be taken after September 1, 2019.

November - Holiday Urban Landscape: An urban landscape that features a holiday theme. Color only. Must be taken after November 1, 2019.

The monthly meeting of the Austin Shutterbug Club was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Vice President Stennis Shotts. There were 44 attendees.

Stennis reviewed the calendar of events:

• President Brian Loflin's workshop on time lapse photography will be held Saturday, November 16.

• The November 7 meeting will be evaluations.

• The Christmas party and awards is scheduled for Thursday, December 7.

Stennis presented the program, a "non-techie" presentation on Infrared Photography and demonstration of how powerful infrared photos are.

For conversion of cameras to infrared one recommendation is LifePixel. They have new and used IR cameras and will convert your camera or sell you one that is already converted. Types of Conversion and various Processing methods, programs and software were discussed by Stennis, Rose Epps, Pete Holland and Phil Charlton. Not all cameras and lenses are suitable for infrared and Cameras and lenses to use or not use were suggested.

A slide show of IR photos from Rose, Pete and Lois Schubert was shown.

The meeting adjourned at 8:17 p.m.
