This marked a homecoming of sorts as lowa County hosted the first such hunt 32 years ago. lowa Pheasants Forever brought the event back to lowa County with the help of local landowners including the Amana Society, area merchant supporters, lowa County bird dog owners and guides. Forty-five hunters hunted in lowa County starting their day at breakfast at the the Die Heimat, Next Door Event Center. Die Heimat Country Inn, Zuber's Homestead Hotel and Rawson's Bed and Breakfast all provided lodging for the hunters who required overnight lodging. Meals were provided by Myers Grill and Catering and volunteers from the Amana Church working in support of the Amana Church youth group and youth ministries.
