Everyone around you today needs hope. Living the resurrection is the source of hope.


Take a moment and reflect on these words from Karl Rahner, a German theologian:

Our loan application has been submitted to Thrivent to refinance the land mortgage. When accepted, this will reduce our monthly loan payment by almost half.

The response from state highway administration is that we would need engineered drawings of a single new driveway with acceleration and de-acceleration lanes. At the time of writing of this for the April newsletter, Delegate Matt Morgan's office had been contacted and they are looking into our case. Keep watch for updates on the bulletin board on the right side as you come in, on our website, and announcements after worship service.

At a recent voters meeting, the members of Saint Paul's overwhelmingly approved the building of an educational facility to replace the old chapel with two modular units which will be located where the old chapel exists today.

At the March Church Council meeting, we discussed the status of the building plan and also, the council chairman, Paul Mehrkam, included in the agenda a discussion on planning the future use of the new facility once it is completed. I had suggested the topic to Paul because as an Elder, I believe we need to be proactively planning for the future of the church, and how it can best serve the members of the congregation as well as the community at large. Obviously, the first priority is to be able to provide the necessary room to conduct Sunday School for the children and Vacation Bible School in the summer for our congregation children as well as children out of the community.

Beyond these immediate needs what else can we do with the blessing our Lord is handing to us in the form of the new facility? Based upon the discussions at the Council meeting, it was determined that it will be beneficial to begin a dialogue on this topic. To that end, the council has chartered an informal committee to research, discuss and explore ideas for the future use of the facility. I have been assigned to chair this committee and Gene Bostwick has agreed to co-chair.

It is our belief that the best ideas will come from you, the members of Saint Paul's. We have not established any deadlines for this project. If anyone has an idea about how we can go forward with utilizing our new facility please pass them on to Gene or myself. We look forward to your thoughts. We will take any ideas submitted and investigate those that the council considers viable.

With Gods guidance, we will make the best use of the facility we are about to receive.




When our boys lose their soccer games, we always tell them "it's not whether you win or lose, it's how you play the game."
