

As you might expect, there will be a fair bit of singing - we are going to be learning some easy Taizé songs as part of the worship. They are shorter (usually about 45 mins or so) easy to digest (no complicated sermon to go away and Think About) and ideal for families with school age children.




Dyrham & Hinton WI Book Club (Read Between the Wines):



- The Parish Council what does it do? The parish council works to serve the needs of the local community. It is responsible for a range of local matters and makes decisions about issues that affect Wick and Abson. The most common are planning matters (the council is a statutory consultee); monitoring development at the quarry (it's all gone very quiet - Ed); crime prevention; managing village assets such as the bus shelters, village hall, sports ground, play areas and Brockwell Park; supporting local events, our volunteer litter pickers and flower trough gardeners; and campaigning for better facilities.






The Governing Body is made up of Parent Governors, Staff Governors and Co-opted Governors who are expected to:

Address the Alarming Pollution of River Boyd

The pollution of our waterways is an urgent environmental concern that demands immediate action. In 2022 alone, the River Boyd was contaminated by sewage a staggering 139 times.

This results in the river being unfit for recreational activities and endangering the delicate ecosystem that depends on its health. We cannot afford to ignore this critical issue, which is why it is crucial for concerned citizens like you to make their voices heard. By writing to our Member of Parliament, Luke Hall, we can collectively demand stronger measures to protect and restore the River Boyd

The Environmental Impact:

The repeated pollution events experienced by the River Boyd have devastating consequences for both the environment and local communities. Sewage spills introduce harmful pathogens, chemicals, and excess nutrients into the water, resulting in a severe imbalance in the river's ecosystem. 
