We are pleased to announce that two of our existing scholarships have become endowed scholarships to benefit Touchet students. An endowment is a permanent fund set up to provide yearly scholarship distributions from the earned investment income, while maintaining the principle. The minimum contribution to establish an endowed scholarship is \$10,000.

Dave Reppe Memorial Scholarship

On March 26, 2013, the Touchet Community lost a long time supporter and friend, Dave Reppe, after a long and valiant battle with cancer. Dave grew up in Klamath Falls, Oregon and graduated from Oregon State University in 1969. He and his wife Sandy moved to Touchet in 1972. Dave farmed for a number of years, and later went to work for the US Postal Service. Their two boys, Doug and Darin, attended and graduated from Touchet Schools.

Dave Reppe and his wife, Sandy have been involved in Everything Touchet, especially when it has to do with the school and kids. Dave was a charter member of Touchet Educational Foundation board of directors and was our President for 4 years. He gave countless hours and much wisdom to our organization on behalf of students and their pursuit of their educational goals. After his death last year, Dave's family funded an endowed scholarship for a Touchet student with plans to attend a college in Oregon.
