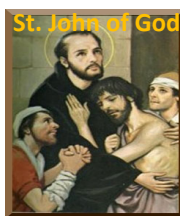

†SAINTS/FEASTS OF THE WEEK†

Mar. 7-St. Perpetua and Felicity—A young, educated noblewoman and mother from Carthage, North Africa, St. Perpetua fiercely proclaimed her Christian faith for which she was imprisoned, tortured and publicly sacrificed. St. Felicity, a pregnant slave girl imprisoned along with St. Felicity, was also tortured and publicly sacrificed.

Mar. 8-St. John of God—A Portuguese soldier turned health care worker in Spain, after having a vision of Mary, St. John of God worked with the poor and established a house to tend to the needs of the sick poor. His followers later formed the Hospitallers of St. John of God which is dedicated to the care of the poor, sick and those suffering from mental disorders.

Mar. 9-St. Frances of Rome—Born in Rome to a wealthy, noble family, St. Frances of Rome was a wife, mother, mystic, organizer of charitable services and a Benedictine oblate who founded a religious community of oblates, who share a common life without religious vows.

REGULATIONS ON FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

FASTING: To be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 years (inclusive). On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection (USCCB).

ABSTINENCE: Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays during Lent.

FASTING, ALMSGIVING AND PRAYER are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

NOTE: *If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self denial that are suitable to their condition.*

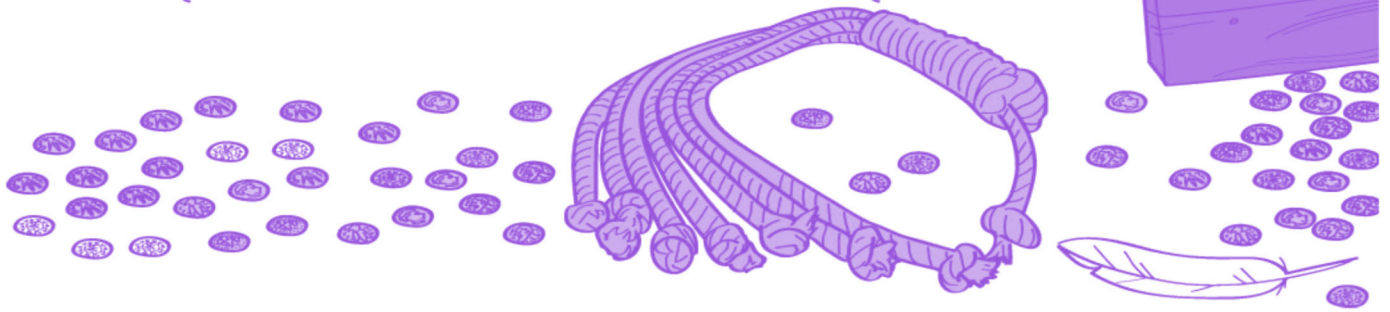

La vida podría ser más fácil si sólo hubiera una lista de reglas que pudiéramos seguir. De hecho, existe esa lista en el libro del Éxodo. Las reglas ofrecen un sentido falso de seguridad que si las seguimos pareciera que hemos hecho lo necesario. Nuestra fe cristiana, sin embargo, está enraizada no en reglas, sino en Jesucristo, cuya vida, muerte y resurrección desafían todas las reglas. Jesús sabía que la fuerza nace de la debilidad y que la sabiduría nace de la necesidad. La vida de Jesús encarna esta paradoja. Lo que Jesús sabía cuándo fue a Jerusalén y entró al área del templo era que la casa de su Padre se había convertido en un mercado, un lugar para el comercio, intercambio mercantil de bienes por dinero. Lo que el templo representa, quien Jesús es, es una relación, una relación entre dos almas, de nuestras almas con Dios.


EL CRECIMIENTO EN UNA RELACIÓN

Las reglas son la forma más básica y antigua para formar nuestro comportamiento de acuerdo con

principios y verdades que van más allá de las reglas. Las reglas dicen "No mataras", pero la verdad es que toda la vida es sagrada y debe ser protegida y salvaguardada. La regla es lo menos que puedes hacer. Jesús vivió como si se le exigiera no hacer lo menos sino lo más. Él vivió como si no debiera sólo proteger y salvaguardar las vidas de los demás. Él vivió como si debiera sacrificar su propia vida por las vidas de los demás. Jesús entendió que las reglas no sólo eran para evitar ciertos actos sino para abrazar ciertas verdades. Uno no solamente no debe matar, uno debe tener la fuerza para dar la vida por los demás si es necesario. Uno no debe mentir sino hablar la verdad aun cuando hacerlo parezca tonto. Estas reglas nos describen el comienzo de nuestra comprensión de la fuerza que nace de la debilidad, de la sabiduría que nace de la necesidad. Jesús nos muestra cuánto realmente se necesita.

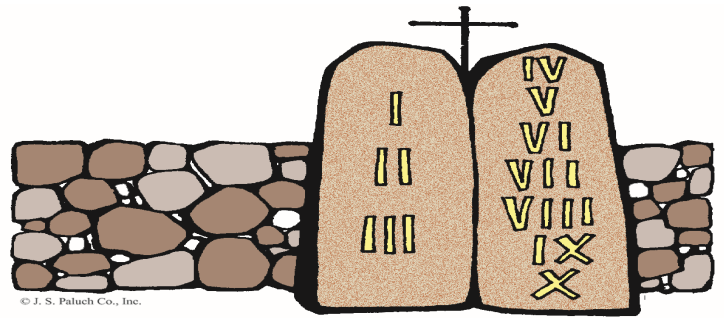

KEEP HOLY THE SABBATH

There's no better way to deepen our Lenten practice than to review the Ten Commandments. The first three, having to do with our right relationship to God, get the most ink. The one we busy people probably have the most problem with is keeping holy the Sabbath.

If we take this commandment literally, babies will go undiapered and dishes will stay on the table, or perhaps meals will not be served. The sick will go unattended and nothing that has anything to do with physical labor will be done. Is mental labor really work? How about changing that dirty diaper (poor baby!)?

We need to depend on God to discern how to observe real Sabbath time in our lives. The point of this commandment is that God has given us a great gift: one whole day per week when we are free to rest, worship God, sing, feast, love, and rejoice. As Psalm 19 proclaims: "The law of the LORD is perfect, / refreshing the soul" (19:8). Our Sabbath rest is a great gift, to be received from God with joy, not with nitpicking. *Copyright © J. S. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

If your parish is reading from Year B of the Lectionary today, and not Year A, as is normally done when there are elect present for the scrutinies and preparing for Easter baptism, you hear about Jesus driving the money-changers from the temple. If you wished to get as close as possible to this site today, you would in fact be at a Muslim shrine, the Dome of the Rock, built on the ruins of Herod's temple. Archeologists believe that this striking, gold-domed crown of a shrine is set precisely where the Holy of Holies once was. Jews believe that the rock is the exact spot where Abraham was prepared to sacrifice Isaac. It is not a mosque, as some think, but a shrine, the oldest one in the Muslim world. For them, the rock is the place from which the Prophet Mohammed ascended on a visit to heaven. The Crusaders mistook the shrine for the actual Temple of Solomon, and the infamous Knights Templar used it as their headquarters and model for their churches elsewhere. The geometric perfection of the shrine is a mathematician's dream. The inscriptions are not exactly hospitable though, since they encourage Christians to "depart from error" and declare that "Jesus son of Mary was only a messenger of God." In ancient times, those who prayed here after walking around the bearer were given a certificate entitling the bearer to admission to paradise. The ticket had to be buried with them. — *Rev.
