It is a place to socialize, which is crucial for the mental well-being as one ages. It is so important to keep active, physically and mentally, we always say "aging isn't for sissies," people are living longer, our job is to help them stay independent and active so they can enjoy their "golden years." But most importantly for our seniors, we offer services to help them maintain their independence, transportation, adult care program, homemaking, providing educational information to help with daily living, help at home assistance, we can help with sign up for Meals on Wheels, help sign up for food boxes, (we are a location pick-up for food boxes monthly) Medicare enrollment/education assistance. There are so many important services we offer outside of the center, but we also invite you to come in and make some new friends. We have some of the best members around, just ask our members from other counties that prefer our center because our folks are so nice and welcoming and just plain fun to hang out with. I'm glad there is a special month to celebrate senior centers, but I think we need to celebrate and spread the word about how important our center and all centers are to seniors every month.

I have a couple of our annual audits coming up, one this month and one in November. All part of our requirements for our COAAA grant funding. These funds are so important for the center so we need to make sure we are doing everything required of us. The funds help us pay for the services we provide, transportation, adult day center, supportive service, it's doesn't begin to cover the expenses of the programs, but every little bit helps.

Just a little update on the side lot, we are planning to blacktop it in the next few weeks. We considered chip/seal but frankly, it isn't much cheaper than blacktop so the board decided to go with the blacktop, it will last longer with minimal maintenance. We were also concerned that some of our members may have an issue walking on the chip/seal surface, we wouldn't want anyone to fall. We are using some of our bingo funding to help pay for this project. Thank goodness we have bingo revenue saved back for these projects and recent repairs. We have so much we would like to do on the side lot, but it is going to take some time and money. Have you been shopping on **Amazon smile** to donate to the center yet? I sure have, we received our first deposit from Amazon in August, only \$18.03, but hey, we are just getting started. 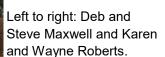


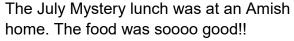

Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA—If you are 70 1/2 or older and have an IRA, you know that each year you must take your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). But did you know that you can make a transfer directly from your IRA to a charity of your choice and the contribution is not taxed? You can give up to \$100,000 from your IRA to a charity and it will be counted towards your RMD but isn't included in your adjusted gross income. Hobo Dinner Foil Packets

Here is something fun for the summer months. This can be done on a grill or in the oven.

- 1 lb. lean ground beef
- 1 pkg. onion soup mix
- 4 small potatoes, peeled and sliced
- 2 cups chopped carrots
- 1 large thinly sliced onion
- 2 tbsp. Olive oil
- 1 tsp. garlic powder

Salt and pepper to taste

1 can condensed mushroom soup

In the Kitchen with Joanna

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Combine ground beef and soup mix in a bowl. Form into 4 patties and set aside. In a large bowl combine the remaining ingredients except the mushroom soup. Toss until well mixed.

Spray 4 sheets of 12 x 18 foil with pan spray. Place ½ of the vegetable mixture onto the center of the foil sheets. Top with one of the beef patties. Put 2 tablespoons of mushroom soup on top of each patty. Seal foil packet wells. Place beef side up on a large baking sheet and bake 35-45 minutes or until potato and carrots are tender. Note: these foil packets can also be grilled at medium heat for 45 minutes or until the potatoes are tender and beef reaches 160 degrees.
