Luke 18:9-14 The Tax Collector Confessed before God.





7:29-30 (All the people, even **tax collectors**, when they heard Jesus' words, acknowledged that God's way was right because they have been baptized by John. But the Pharisees and experts in the law rejected God's purpose for themselves, because they had not been baptized by John.)





19:1-4, Jesus entered Jericho and was passing through. A man was there by the name of Zacchaeus; he was **a chief tax collector and was wealthy**. He wanted to see who Jesus was, but being a short man he could not, because of the crowd. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree to see him, since Jesus was coming by.





23:47, **the Centurion,** seeing what had happened, praised God and said, 'Surely, this was **a righteous man.'**


23:48, When **all the people**, who had gathered to witness this sight saw what took place, they **beat their breasts** and went away.

23:49, all those who knew him [Jesus], including **the women** who followed him from Galilee, **stood at a distance**, watching these things.
