NATIONAL FIRE PREVENTION WEEK MESSAGE – All week, Templeton's Firefighters are carrying an educational fire safety message to Templeton students at Templeton Elementary School and Vineyard Elementary School in conjunction with the annual Burn Run which will stop at TES tomorrow (Oct 11) morning. Firefighters from all over the north county will stop at TES for a short demonstration and Templeton Firefighters will present a check to the Alissa Ann Ruch Burn Foundation.

While younger students will learn fire safety lessons that many will remember for the rest of their lives, Fire Prevention Week also carries the same message to adults. *This year's campaign is titled, "Look. Listen. Learn. Be Aware. Fire Can Happen Anywhere."*

- Look for places where fire could start. Take a good look around your home or business. Identify potential fire hazards and take care of them.
- Listen for the sound of the smoke alarm. You could have only moments to escape safely once the smoke alarm sounds. Go to your outside meeting place, which should be a safe distance from your home or business – a place where everyone knows to meet.
- Learn two ways out of every room and make sure all doors and windows leading outside open easily and are free of clutter.

SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET IN THE RED – The Templeton Unified School District (TUSD) Board of Trustees will meet on *Thursday, October 11th at 6 pm* in Room A25 at Templeton High School (THS). The [agenda](#) includes:

- [5.1] Normally, changes that occur to budgets adopted by school districts are formal documents that are approved in interim budget revisions presented to the Board in December and March. However, several changes have occurred to both revenues and expenses in the 2018/19 General Fund Budget since it was adopted in June of this year. *Because the District's budget is projected to remain at a deficit position for the current and two fiscal years out – absent corrective action – as a result, close monitoring of the budget is warranted.*

Editor's Note! The most important responsibility of a school board is the budget. With the current budget running in the red – and projected to be in the red at least two more years out – this school board and its successor will have some very difficult and challenging decisions to make. Those decisions will require a great deal of courage and the willingness to do some very hard work. This report on the budget will take place early in the meeting – please consider making time to attend and learn first-hand what the issues are. Keep in mind that “corrective measures” almost always mean CUTS.
