Amana Church VBS Volunteers Needed

The recent 50-degree, sunshine-filled days got us all daydreaming about Spring and Summer, and that means the Amana Church Youth Activities Committee is starting to daydream about (and plan) Vacation Bible School! There are three ways (so far) that we could use help.

- 1) We would appreciate some extra "Helpers" who are able to attend from 8:30-11:30 to help at the activity stations. Helpers will not be responsible for planning or leading activities but will assist the children in the activity that the Lead Teacher is instructing. Helpers are also essential in helping younger kids find the restroom, providing occasional TLC after a collision during games, and cleaning up small messes. Helpers can volunteer for one day or numerous days. Helpers need to be in middle school (have completed 6th grade) or older. There is no maximum age!
- 2) We need some "Babysitters" who are available to supervise children from 8:30-9:00 (before VBS starts) in the morning. Each morning, the Lead Teachers and Helpers meet to discuss the lesson for the day and complete a brief devotional; this leaves several children of Lead Teachers and Helpers unattended! Additionally, VBS attendees begin to trickle in around 8:45. Babysitters would supervise the children in the main Saal of the Amana Church, and supplies to entertain the children (colors, music, etc.) would be provided. Babysitters can volunteer for one day or numerous days. They need to be in high school (have completed 9th grade) or older (again, no maximum age!).
- 3) We are looking for new or used 4-inch Terra Cotta pots to use for a craft that each child will complete. We will need at least 60-70 pots in all.

A Eulogy for Old Creamery Theatre

We gather today to mourn the passing of a dear friend and a legend in the tapestry of lowa culture for 50 years: The Old Creamery Theatre Company. In early February, 2022 an announcement quietly appeared on the Old Creamery website telling us she had died from "COVID."

Those of us who knew her best, don't accept that convenient explanation. We call into question the decisions made by the handful of remaining board members who retained ultimate power over her life or death and chose to pull the plug. We had begun to fear for Old Creamery's health and well-being in recent months when we saw her worldly possessions (costumes, sets, props, equipment, vehicles, and even her cast house) being sold off and/or donated. We began to wonder what would become of the nearly half a million dollars in COVID relief grant funding she had been awarded.

We question why, while other theatres fought to stay relevant, visible, and connected to audiences during the pandemic, that the Old Creamery's Board of Trustees kept her virtually silent. Why have recent public statements made by the organization's board place the final production in March of 2020 when the dedicated theatre staff worked diligently to continue producing streaming shows and, as the weather warmed, in-person outdoor productions through June? Was it really a prudent decision to unceremoniously fire every single member of the Artistic staff in early July of 2020, especially when there were already outdoor performances and youth camps booked throughout the remainder of the summer that had to be cancelled? Are we really to believe the Trustees wanted to see Old Creamery recover? Whatever the reason for her passing, she is gone. Today we celebrate her life and legacy.

The Old Creamery Theatre was conceived by Thomas P. Johnson, an educator at lowa State, and a small group of his visionary students who served as founding members. She was born in Garrison, lowa in 1971 and moved permanently to Amana in 1996 where she lived out the remainder of her full and artistic life.

Her influence over 50 years is undeniable. For the thousands of artists who worked on and behind her stages, the Old Creamery was a muse; a place to create, thrive, and grow as a professional. For her patrons, Old Creamery was a place to meet, to laugh, and to challenge their minds. For children it was a magical place to engage their imaginations and nurture their talents.

Despite the name, Old Creamery was never just a building. She was never a single person or group of people. She was a spirit; an essence; an everchanging, always aspiring, live theatrical experience. Old Creamery is survived by thousands of theatres across the country, her loving family of dedicated volunteers and professional artists, and you: the hundreds of thousands of patrons who made her existence possible. You were her true life's blood. You thought of her as family and you told her so. She thought of you the same way.

It is the duty of all of us, whose lives were touched in some way by Old Creamery's far-reaching achievements, to honor her memory. Please support all of the incredible area theatre companies who are overcoming the challenges of COVID and are emerging to entertain and fulfill their missions once more.

Rest in peace, Old Creamery Theatre Company. You may be gone, but you will not be forgotten. Thank you for the wonderful memories. We will treasure them...and you...forever.

SPECIAL CCA COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT ELECTION TUESDAY, MARCH 1, 2022

The Clear Creek Amana CSD Special Election that will be held on Tuesday, March 1, 2022. Please note the polling hours for this election will be from 7:00 AM until 8:00 PM.

The following is the polling place for the Clear Creek Amana CSD Special Election:

Lenox/Hilton/Pilot: Fire Station 2725 K St. Middle Amana

Election Day Registration took effect on January 1, 2008. This means you may now register at your precinct on Election Day if you have moved. If you plan to register on Election Day, you will need to provide proof of identity (photo ID), proof of residency (your current address in the precinct), and sign an oath. This process will take extra time at the polling place. Voters are still encouraged to pre-register by Friday February 14, 2022 by 5:00 P.M. in the auditor's office if your residence has changed.

Voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before they may receive and cast a ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered or who have changed precincts also may be required to provide proof of residence. Any voter who cannot show ID may have their identity attested to by another registered voter in the precinct who has proper ID. Starting January 1, 2019, all voters will be required to present an approved form of identification. I love doing needlepoint, but I'm a real snob about it. I have to have the right yarn and then just filling in the background takes forever although I have to admit it can be relaxing.


