Other Ways of Showing Respect

In Ghana there are other actions which may be respectful or otherwise. The left hand is considered a "dirty hand", because it is used to do dirty things, like picking up dirty objects or cleaning oneself after visiting the restroom. As in the gospel of Matthew the goats were put on the left side and they were the accursed (Mt. 25:31ff), so also in my culture, the left side is not considered positive but negative. In view of this, one should not give somebody something with the left hand, or receive it with the left hand. When you hand someone something with your left hand which is unintentional you should support it with your right hand under the left hand. If there is no option but to use your left hand to give something to another you should excuse yourself for having to do so. Again one should not point to somebody or something with the left had. It is considered very rude and disrespectful if a younger person is found doing it. When someone enters your home and you are having meals, you are to invite him or her to join you, whether you know him or not, and also whether you knew he was coming or not. Failure to do that means you are selfish or not hospitable. The one invited can take one or two morsels and say that he or she is fine. He can also decline the invitation which is acceptable. On the other hand, if a stranger eats everything he is given without leaving something small on the plate, he may be considered a glutton or might be too hungry. A stranger is always given a chair and offered water immediately. Then his mission is asked before anything can go on. A stranger is always treated with respect and dignity, but he should not be looking round the room or house repeatedly. I must say that of late, due to the attitude of some strangers being fishy, people are a bit skeptical about who comes to their homes. All the same, basic hospitality of giving water and listening to the reason why the visitor is there is still important and is adhered to.


