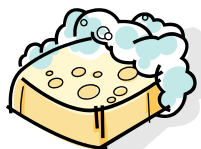

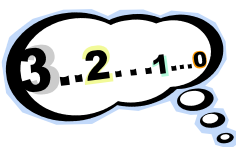
- ♦ January 18 - CLOSED (MLK)

Early Math Development

We adults tend to judge a child's progress in math by his/her ability to count out loud and recognize written numbers. While these are important skills, research shows that early math development is really much more complex. According to the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), problem solving and reasoning are the "heart" of mathematics. Preschoolers should learn math through playful activities such as pouring, measuring, creating patterns with small manipulatives, constructing with blocks, playing simple strategy games (like Candyland, Memory, Matching, etc.), and even participating in dress-up and dramatic play, music, and art. Superficial teaching, such as memorizing and rote learning with flashcards at the expense of a deeper understanding, may really just develop a shaky foundation in math. So, when you see your child lining up several objects in a row, sorting objects by color, categorizing, building a block tower, counting (even out of order), making comparisons about quantities or sizes, putting together a puzzle, and dumping and pouring water or sand into cups, be proud that you have a budding mathematician on your hands!
