Naturally Yours: To Be or Not To Be A Bee **Denise Semion** If you live with someone who is allergic to wasp stings, you quickly learn that there is a difference between wasps and bees. I try not to say "watch out, there's a bee" because Bill will quickly tell me the correct type of stinging insect it is, often a yellow jacket, wasp or hornet. So, I try to say, "there's a stinging insect" instead. He needs to know the difference for medical reasons, but we all should know the difference for our survival. We need bees if we want to eat food. It's just that simple. Honeybees pollinate 80 percent of the crops that provide 90 percent of most of the food grown in the United States. So if you think bees and wasps are all the same, think again. Bees are beneficial to us. It can be confusing to tell the difference between wasps, yellow jackets, hornets and honeybees, as all of these insects can sting you. All yellow jackets are wasps, but not all wasps are yellow jackets. Hornets are the largest of wasps. Honeybees typically need to be provoked to attack; wasps are more prone to be aggressive. Bees are

hairy; wasps usually have smooth and shiny skin. Whether this helps you identify these stinging insects or not, the important thing to remember is that we need bees to pollinate our food. I've watched Bill gently help a struggling honeybee out trouble, placing it in an area where it can get a quick rest and then fly away. So now that spring is finally here, you might see a bee visiting your flowers. And you see a wasp buzzing around your gutters. Be kind to bees, we need them. And the next time you see a stinging insect, please don't call it a bee unless it is – it may be a bee, but it might not.

TIME-If you observe any of the above symptoms call 9-1-1 immediately, an old commercial said time lost is brain lost

There are a few other symptoms a person may complain of, namely a headache that comes on suddenly out of nowhere especially one in time with their heartbeat
