MINUTES of the November 17th, 2015 General Meeting of Nature Moncton

HELD at the Rotary Pavilion, Rotary Park, Moncton, New Brunswick.

PRESENT: About 45 members, by Dale Gaskin's count.

President John Foster **called** the meeting **to order** at about 7:00 p.m. AST and welcomed those present. He asked whether there were any **Guests** and a couple introduced themselves. The President took a visual **Roll Call** and concluded that a **Quorum** existed.

Notice of the time and place of the meeting had been emailed to all members at least a day before the meeting, so the meeting was deemed **duly constituted** for the transaction of business.

Roger Leblanc introduced the **Guest Speaker**, Professor Tony Diamond of the University of New Brunswick. Tony delivered an interesting presentation on *Recent Changes in the Marine Ecosystem of the Bay of Fundy*. Following the presentation, and a number of questions from the audience, the President thanked Tony and presented him with a gift in appreciation of his remarks. The Break then took place at 8:10 p.m. Following the **Break**, the meeting resumed at about 8:30 p.m.

The President asked whether everybody had had an opportunity to read the **Minutes** of the October 20th, 2015 Meeting of Nature Moncton which had been printed in the Newsletter circulated by email. He asked whether anybody had noted any errors or omissions. None were raised. UPON MOTION duly moved by Secretary John Filliter, seconded by Norm Belliveau and unanimously carried, it was resolved to **adopt** the said Minutes as circulated.

Treasurer Margaret Fanjoy presented her **Financial Report** from September 30th to October 31st, 2015. Receipts had totalled \$280.05 and Disbursements of \$35.83 had been paid, bringing the Balance as of October 31st to \$5,511.54. UPON MOTION duly moved by Margaret Fanjoy, seconded by Rosemary MacAulay and unanimously carried, it was resolved to **adopt** the said Financial Report as presented.

Bird Alert: David Christie reported that sightings of a Franklin Gull, Cape May Warbler, Summer Tanager and Tropical Kingbird had caused great excitement recently.

Ways and Means: Dale Gaskin conducted the 50-50 Draw, with John Foster drawing Susan Atkinson's number for the \$16.00 draw prize and a draw was also held for the door prizes (a suet feeder and a bird house book).

Nature Information Line: Nelson Poirier reported that he had procured a back-up recorder through Amazon.com but received no bill for it yet. The Line has been working well.

Field Trips/Workshops Committee: Louise Nichols reported that Nelson's annual *Birdfeeding Workshop* at Tankville School on November 8th had gone well, and a subsequent field trip to the Sackville Waterfowl Park had been well attended. Roger Leblanc will be presenting a *Winter Birds* workshop on December 5th and more workshops are being planned for the winter.

Membership: Shirley Hunt reported that 62 members have renewed their memberships since August.

Newsletter: Susan Atkinson reported that the November issue had been a little late and that the December one will be early, to give notice of the Annual General Meeting. The deadline for submissions will be November 22nd. Any members willing to have their photographs on the Nature Moncton blog published in the Newsletter should email their permission to Susan.

Environment Ideas: Susan Atkinson noted that Irving had pleaded guilty to the charges resulting from the killing of 7,500 or so migrating songbirds by the flare at Canaport, and been fined \$750,000.00.

Irishtown Nature Park: Committee Secretary David Cannon reported that INP had begun its new year, with Alyre Chiasson as President. INP has adopted a new Vision Statement to protect and promote the ecological integrity of the park. David is working with President Foster on the letter

to be sent to the new Moncton-Dieppe-Riverview M.P. asking that funds be allocated now for replacing the causeway over the Petitcodiac River between Moncton and Riverview.

Joys and Sorrows: Cathi Smith was not present to report but a member reported that Ray Gallant's father had passed away. The President expressed our condolences to the Gallant family.

Web Site: Susan Atkinson reported for Katherin Atkinson that the old website is finally gone and the new one should be up and running soon, perhaps as early as this weekend. Members should keep sending website submissions to Katherin through Susan's email address.

Next Monthly Program: The President reported that the December 8th Program will include the 2015 Annual General Meeting of the Club and a presentation on the Christmas Bird Count by Roger Leblanc, along with photographs of birds he has been studying.

Members should note that the next monthly meeting will be held on the 2nd Tuesday of December, NOT the usual third Tuesday.

New Business: The President asked if there was any New Business. Dale Gaskin reported that a new asphalt plant is proposed to be built between Coverdale and the Pine Glen Road. He said that there are traffic and environmental issues we should be concerned about.

Sightings: A Hairy Woodpecker tapped its beak on the glass in Dale Gaskin's shed to notify him that it needed to be released; Norm Belliveau saw Brant, Sanderlings, Dunlins and a Short-eared Owl at Little Cape; a female Cardinal has been observed in Riverview; an American Goldfinch with a white cap returned to the area this year; Snowy Owls have been seen in Molus River, Dieppe and Miscou; and a Red-tailed Hawk has been hunting around bird houses in the area. Roger Leblanc speculated that the reason Snowy Owls may be seen more frequently now than during the winter is that they are feeding on sea ducks now.

There being no further business, UPON MOTION by Dale Gaskin, the meeting was **adjourned** at 9:01 p.m. AST.

Upcoming Workshop



News flash: winter is coming! But instead of getting depressed over something so natural that can't be changed, a lot of bird watchers are looking forward to winter because the changing season will bring with it the chance to see some of those famous "winter birds" that seasoned birders talk about all the time. Which species are we talking about and why – and when are they coming?

These are the kinds of questions that will be addressed in the upcoming workshop offered by Nature Moncton on "winter birds." Join Roger LeBlanc who has been watching and trying to understand the behaviors of these winter visitors for a long time. And if you by chance participated in the recent bird feeding workshop offered by Nature Moncton, this would be a very natural follow-up to help you recognize what you might be attracting to your backyard. Together we will try to work out some of the patterns that will help you know what is to be expected as well as when and where you should be looking. In addition, Roger will help you understand exactly what you are looking at on that snow-covered branch in a workshop that will combine bird photographs with a few video surprises.

So whether you are quite content with checking out the "winter birds" that will be invading your feeders or are ready to bundle up and head outside to search for them in the snow-covered landscape, this workshop aims to help you enjoy their presence even more. Roger will also talk about the annual Christmas Bird Counts that take place throughout the province. Roger is the organizer of the Moncton count and is always looking for eager participants – a chance to put your new knowledge of winter birds to work!


