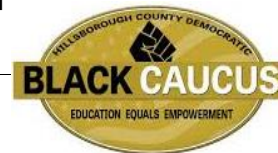

No. 1 Constitutional Amendment, Article IX, Section 4 and Article XII Partisan Election of Members of District School Boards
 Proposing to require members of district school boards to be elected in a partisan election rather than a nonpartisan election.

No. 2 Constitutional Amendment, Article I, Section 28 Right to Fish and Hunt
 Proposing to preserve forever fishing and hunting, including by the use of traditional methods.

No. 3 Constitutional Amendment, Article X, Section 29 Adult Personal Use of Marijuana
 Allows adults 21 years or older to possess, purchase, or use marijuana products and marijuana accessories for non-medical personal consumption; allows Medical Marijuana Treatment Centers, and other state licensed entities, to acquire, cultivate, process, manufacture, sell, and distribute such products and accessories. THIS PROPOSED AMENDMENT IS ESTIMATED TO HAVE A NET POSITIVE IMPACT ON THE STATE BUDGET, GENERATING ADDITIONAL REVENUE OR AN INCREASE IN GOVERNMENT SERVICES

No. 4 Constitutional Amendment, Article I, New Section Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion
 No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion before viability or when necessary to protect the patient's health, as determined by the patient's healthcare provider. This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.

No. 5 Constitutional Amendment, Article VII, Section 6 and Article XII Annual Adjustments to the Value of Certain Homestead Exemptions
 Proposing an annual adjustment for inflation to the value of current or future homestead exemptions for which every person who has legal or equitable title to real estate and maintains thereon the permanent residence of the owner, or another person legally or naturally dependent upon the owner is eligible.

 Proposing repeal of public financing provision for campaigns with spending limits.

No. 1 Hillsborough County Referendum Renewal of Community Investment Half-Cent Sales Tax Through December 31, 2041
 Shall Hillsborough County renew the existing local government infrastructure surtax, known locally as the community investment half-cent sales tax, commencing December 1, 2026, through December 31, 2041, to be shared with the municipalities and the School Board to fund infrastructure for transportation and public works, public safety, public facilities, public utilities and public schools?

 To provide educational excellence for student learning by ensuring competitive salaries to retain and recruit high quality teachers and staff, implementing and preserving academic programs, and distributing proportional funds pursuant to Florida law with charter schools, shall the School District of Hillsborough County levy an ad valorem operating millage of one mill annually from July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2029, with annual reporting to county residents for transparency of the use of funds?
