Dojo Profile of One of Our Own

Martial Arts Training Service (MATS)
Naperville, Illinois

Professor Maureen Browne and her husband, Sensei John Gussman, established MATS in 1992. Their dojo provides beginning and advanced training in Danzan Ryu Jujitsu, Judo and Aikido. Students coming from 15 different countries train regularly together at MATS.

Professor Browne has been training in Danzan Ryu since 1970 and holds the rank of Shichidan (7th dan) in Danzan Ryu from Shoshin Ryu Yudanshakai and Godan (5th dan) in Aikido from Birankai North American.

Sensei John Gussman began his training in Kodokan Judo in 1962 and competed on a national level until 1978. At MATS, he coaches national and international judo competitors at the junior and senior level. Sensei Gussman holds the rank of Godan (5th dan) in Danzan Ryu and Yodan (4th dan) in judo and is a nationally certified judo coach.

The Pacific Jujitsu Alliance embraces honesty, integrity and professional ethics. We invite selected black belts to join our alliance. The quality of our membership

is more important than quantity. It is made very clear to all perspective members that we do not encourage them to drop their membership with any DZR organization they currently belong to.

We do not demand loyalty to the PJA. Loyalty should be to one's sensei and then to Danzan Ryu and the teachings of Professor Henry S. Okazaki. The PJA believes the purpose of any DZR organization is to support its members and to protect, preserve and perpetuate the teachings of Professor Henry S. Okazaki.

The Pacific Jujitsu Alliance currently has 106 black belt members. Many of these black belts also belong to other Danzan Ryu organizations. Here is a breakdown of the memberships.

- 50 American Judo & Jujitsu Federation
- 34 Kilohana Martial Arts Association
- 19 Shoshin Ryu Yudanshakai
- 19 Pacific Jujitsu Alliance only DZR organization they are members of.
- 4 American Jujitsu Institute

Japanese Martial Arts Character Dictionary

Professor Thomas Jenkins spent several years researching and writing a Japanese martial arts character dictionary specifically designed for English speaking martial artists.

"The people of the English speaking world who study traditional Japanese martial arts are confronted with the challenge of learning the terminology of the Japanese martial arts. Conventional Japanese dictionaries supply words necessary for daily communication in society as a whole but unfortunately lack the technical words of the martial arts. The purpose of this dictionary is to provide the English reader with an accurate listing of the words and phrases of the Japanese martial arts, along with their appropriate Chinese characters, and the English translations from a martial arts point of view. The dictionary can serve as a reliable reference regardless of the reader's skill level in the Japanese language."

The Japanese text of this dictionary was proof-read by Dr. Kimihiko Nomura, Professor of Japanese Language and Culture, California State University, Chico, CA.
