


OUT of Site is a multi-year performance-driven walking tour project, placing theater audiences in physical sites of LGBTQ ancestry in San Francisco neighborhoods. **OUT of Site** tours create an immersive spectacle in real time and in public space, using sidewalks, plazas, parks, and POPOS. In 2018, we launched **OUT of Site** as a pilot tour in North Beach/Barbary Coast reviving historic sites with stories from several decades. This on-the-streets approach marries the notions of community-driven, often overlooked history with an interdisciplinary performance celebrating the legacies of queer ancestors. **OUT of Site** is a unique collaboration with Shaping San Francisco, known for its walking and bike tours that document and archive overlooked stories of San Francisco.
