

Report on the Synodal Process



It was with gratitude to Pope Francis that the Diocese of Grand Falls $oldsymbol{\perp}$ began its Synodal Journey on the Solemnity of our Diocesan Patroness - Mary, the Immaculate Conception. The committee began by familiarizing itself with the concept of SYNOD, the history of synods in the Church, the Holy Father's vision of a Synodal Church and the documents produced as guides. Once familiar with the process, the committee set out on its journey. 48 listening sessions were held throughout the diocese with almost 700 persons participating. Based on responses heard and recorded, it was decided to create two reports; one to be forwarded to the synodal Church Atlantic Region and a second to be used at our own diocesan and parish communion | participation | mission levels.
