



<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr. Sun is extremely intelligent and kind, and he is always very open to questions and "deltas" to make the course and each other better. His chosen readings are super helpful and insightful, and I learned a lot of unique things that I wouldn't have thought of on my own. It is one of the most practical honors seminars offered, and I would definitely suggest it to a friend! However, the semester-long project did not transfer well at all to an online format, and he was not super accommodating in changing the requirements. • I was not as comfortable sharing personal stories and that seems to have made an impact on the class overall. I think people are a little more complicated and it's hard to select one story out of eighteen years to tell essentially strangers. So maybe the less genuine seeming story is the only one they felt comfortable to tell because that vulnerability is difficult with sensitive subjects. • This class was genuinely AWESOME! I signed up for it without knowing anything about the course (I think it is new) or the instructor. I am SO happy I took it. I got to know my classmates more in this class than in any other. Part of that was the group activity, but also the story-telling we did. It was definitely my favorite class of the semester. Also, I got to know Dr. Sun much better than most of my other professors. I still don't know how he taught the class so well... he drives like 3 hours each way to commute to CNU and had a baby delivered during the semester. Crazy. If this course isn't made a regular honors course, CNU & the Honors department is seriously missing out. Also, CNU should consider offering it as a leadership elective. I learned more about leadership here than in most of my other leadership courses. It would work great as a senior capstone, I think. Anyways, I really enjoyed it and Dr. Sun is definitely one of the best professors at CNU. The feedback/coaching he gave us was insanely detailed and thoughtful. • I was unsure of what to expect when beginning this course. I am not great at public speaking, so I was nervous about the requirements, and the fact that the course is very politics/social oriented. However, this was one of the best courses I've taken at CNU, even though I am a freshman. Dr. Sun was very understanding when assigning coursework and made sure it was not too much. The course allowed me to make a meaningful impact in society through our group project, and I've created strong relationships with my team members, and hope to continue to work with them on our project in the future. Dr. Sun's class allowed me to think creatively about how to adapt to changing situations, such as transitioning to an online version of class. He coached each student and encouraged others to step up and coach others as well. In this class, we were encouraged to share vulnerable stories in order to find a connection between classmates, which was scary at first, and could probably have been placed later in the semester.
