

Maple: Largest of native maples, somewhat slow growing but desirable for symmetrical form and bright fall colors. Very hardy. Prefers well drained soils. Mature height: 70'. 20' space between trees.





Red Oak: Fastest

grower of the oaks. Dense, lustrous foliage. Red fall color. Leaves hang on tree into winter. Mature height: 70'. 20' space between trees.





Redosier Dogwood: Large, fast growing, many stemmed shrub. White flowers in late spring. Stems turn red in winter, berries are eaten by birds. Tolerant to diverse soil types. Withstand poorly drained soils. Does well in full sun or light shade. Mature height: 10'. 5' space between shrubs.





Purple Lilac: Prefers loam to sandy soils, needs adequate moisture and prefers full light. Purplish flowers, high quality for wildlife cover. Mature height: 8'. 5' space between shrubs.





Red Splendor Crabapple: Adapts to a variety of soils and prefers full sun. Mature height 20-30'. 5' space between shrubs.




American Plum: Native tall shrub/small tree with thorns. Edible fruit for preserves and jellies. Adapts to variety of soils and prefers full sun to partial shade. Mature height is 15-25'. 5' space between shrubs.





Cranberrybush: Hardy and will grow on across of range of soils. Mature height is 5-6'. Can be planted in rows and clipped for hedges. Does well in full sun or shade. 5' space between shrubs.





Cedar) Pyramidal tree grows to 80'. Fast grower and prefers sun to semi-shade and moist wet soils. Tolerant to pruning, will brown in winter. 10' space between trees.





Techny

Arborvitae: Fast growing, denser foliage than other arborvitae, very hardy. Grows best in full sun to partial shade. Mature height: 15'. 10' space between trees.





Red Cedar: Prefers well

drained soils but will tolerate moderately poor drainage, slow to moderate growth rate. Very good to excellent for wildlife. Intolerant to shade. Mature height: 40-50'. 15-20' space between trees.





Norway Pine: Native

red pine. Fast-growing, long-needled evergreen that needs full sunlight to thrive. Prefers drier, well-drained soils. Mature height: 70'. 20' space between trees.





White Pine: Fast growing

with dark green, long needles that keep their color all year. Prefers moist, well drained soil and full to partial sun. Mature height: 90'. 20' space between trees.





Black Hills Spruce:

Noted for its dark green foliage and conical form. Prefers heavier soils, full sun, adequate moisture and clean cultivation. Mature height: 40'. 20' space between trees.





Meyer Spruce: Known as

the Chinese Blue Spruce with rich blue-green needles; compares to Colorado Blue Spruce. Very hardy, grows average 12 inches annually with mature height 45', resistant to diseases that Colorado Blue Spruce isn't. Needs direct sunlight and is tolerate to a variety of soil types. 20' space between trees.





Norway Spruce: Planted in

moist, rich soil, this is the FASTEST growing of the spruce family. Attractive drooping branches, prefers full sun. Mature height: 90'. 20' space between trees





Ouaking Aspen:

Tall, fast growing tree with smooth pale bark (greenish white to gray) and scarred with black. Full sun needed, moist to sand-loam soils needed. 20' space between trees.
