#### Engineer Spotlight

#### The Charlie (Part 2)

Last month's Engineer Spotlight focused on Charlie Mikolajczyk's contributions to the *SAABE Times*. Charlie is on his 74<sup>th</sup> monthly article and is a valuable resource for our members. The following is just a little rundown of Charlie's history in the trade.

Charlie started out in 1975 as a grunt/pre-apprentice in training (PAT) in the electrical trade. At the time he was still in high school. In 1977, he graduated from East Central High School (Crew Leader in Auto Mechanics and 2nd Place winner in the 1977 Plymouth Troubleshooting Contest/State Finals). After graduation, Charlie was picked up by the Master Electrician at the downtown Baptist Memorial Hospital to work in the electrical trade. In 1977 or 1978 (due to boredom), Charlie transferred into the maintenance department (once again as a grunt). He rose through the channels to the position of an Operating Engineer/Shift Leader operating a central plant of approximately 4,600 tons, and specializing in critical environments (Data Centers, CCU, SICU, Autoclaves, ETO gas, etc.).

Upon leaving BMHS, he started another career with Trammell Crow Company in 1990 as a Building Operations Supervisor specializing in central plants and critical environments. Once again, he quickly rose through the ranks to the final position of Senior Building Operations Manager who was directly responsible for the overall operation and maintenance of over 800,000 sf of Class A properties in SA and a World Wide Data Center.

In 1999, Charlie started his present journey with Endeavor Real Estate Group as the Vice President of Engineering, whose overall responsibilities include the

#### Tech Talk #74

#### **Reducing Slip-Fall Liabilities**

One of the most dreaded issues we deal with today involve slip-falls. We don't know the frequency of slip-falls in our local area, but we are certain that if these incidents were tracked, the amounts would be enlightening. The amount of liability your facility may encounter due to a slip-fall greatly depends on your proactive approach. The mathematics are simple – the greater the amount of proactive measures, the lesser the liability.

#### **Awareness**

Awareness and education of the maintenance staff, housekeeping, and the security officers are key factors. Education must be constantly implemented to reduce or eliminate a hazard before it becomes a liability issue.

#### Action

Quick responsive action needs to be implemented upon the discovery of any hazards. Coffee and drink spills occur frequently and without warning. Most often, these occur during peak traffic times. The common protocol should be to immediately clean the area and install a "wet floor" sign. A mop bucket with wet floor stenciling is only good as long the mop bucket is left in the area. Install signs! Other good actions are to always keep these signs in each janitor's closet, and keep multiple signs for use around all the entrances. On rainy days, do not take it for granted that simply because it is raining, everyone should know that it is wet. Once an individual enters the safe haven of your facility, they will not consider that your floors are wet as well. Remind them with a sign. Remember, it's raining outside, not inside, so why would the floor be wet?

#### Inspection

Inspections should occur continuously. Every minute of the day, you, the trained and conscious individual, must constantly observe any conditions which may increase liability, whether it is a loose threshold, deteriorated petty mats, leaking water fountain, etc. It is up to you to inspect, identify, and rectify the issue before it becomes a problem. Back to petty mats: they are basically an architectural feature of limited use. Do not solely depend on these. If at all possible, the installation of additional mats or the use of two mats (with signs) during inclement weather should reduce the possibilities of a slip-fall.

Let's not forget the structured parking (not a parking garage, we'll cover this one later) and the elevator in the structured parking! Better yet, never forget or overlook the stairwells in the structured parking.



Additionally, do not only consider the common areas. If your security patrol makes rounds in your mechanical areas, applying practices here as well may reduce the possibility of the patrol officer slipping due to a water leak or inadequate lighting after hours. If you have ground water seepage or an irrigation problem which is a nuisance, be sure to clean all surfaces if they become slick. Just because it is outside doesn't mean someone will know better than to walk on it or through it (i.e. sidewalks, drives, sluice drains, culverts, etc.)!

#### **Action Steps and Practices**

- If the exterior surfaces are wet (due to rain, mist, or fog), immediately install wet floor signs at all entrances. Do not remove these signs until the exterior surfaces and all interior surfaces are dry.
- If a spill occurs, make an immediate effort to identify this area as a hazard while retrieving clean-up items (paper, paper towel, red shop rag, ladder, etc.). Install wet floor sign, clean up, and leave the wet floor sign until absolutely certain the floor is dry.

- Install additional mats as needed at entrances.
- Watch for wet areas caused by the "shaking out" of umbrellas.
  - Train housekeeping and security.
- If a slip-fall occurs, be sure to document any information (shoe tap missing from high heel shoe, etc.).
- Clean all exterior concrete surfaces which are subject to constant moisture due to ground water seepage.
  - Practice, practice!
