SHOOT REPORT FOR JANUARY 27, 2024 by Walt Evens

Our Match Host was Jim Eikenberry. There were 9 shooters and 3 volunteers. We had decent weather. Out first target was a big Splatter Bullseye at 30 yards with 5 shots and the usual scoring. The second was the 9 dots at 25 yards. One shot each. The points were listed within the circles. The third target was life size deer vitals with 7 shots. If you hit the stomach or liver, you received minus points. This was at 25 yards but probably should have been at 50 to take advantage of the negative scoring possibilities. The last two were just for fun, milk jugs at 25 yards (could have been 50) and clay pigeons at 100 yards.

Everybody had a good time! I'd like to thank the following people, Jim for a great match and for taking photos, Bob Morrell for running targets and Melody Morrell for scoring them. -Walt

Well, now, I was amazed to see those clays on the backstop bank at 100 yards and wonder how folks would do with a regulation muzzleloader 100 yard bull target, at 100 yards. Something to think about if the shoot planner has a sadistic streak. Jim's targets were interesting to score and I hope I got them right. There are always some head-scratchers, such as a nice group of four and where is that fifth hole??? I did find at least one double.

We were given a free booth in the Trophy Room. We set up a mock primitive camp. In addition to the club's information and NMLRA table (National Muzzle Loading Rifle Association - FUML is a Charter Club of this organization). Jim Eikenberry had a nice display of guns and shooting supplies.

We spoke with many folks about our monthly shooting match, muzzleloading shooting and hunting in general

plus advertised our annual Frontier Heritage Fair. They were very impressed with our presentation!

Our spot just inside the door was perfect as people in the lobby could see the colorful striped blankets on the tables and be encouraged to come in and see what was going on. Bob and I brought some camp stuff plus the club's plug-in campfire along with extra firewood to put in front of the little tent. The kids liked it. One of them asked if we knew his grandpa Be'la Foltin, who just happens to be member of the club! I had too many of the Frontier Heritage Fair postcards we send out so brought down a stack to go with the half sheet fliers and by the time the show closed the fliers were gone and there were just three postcards left. Said Walt "I have a good feeling about this year's Frontier Heritage Fair..." So do I - "we're going to get mobbed..."

The club will have two sale tables and members are invited to donate items relating to muzzleloader shooting and rendezvous clothing and supplies. This was a great success last year and we hope to equal it this year. If you have plunder to spare get it to us before the show opens if at all possible so we can price and set it out.

Lorraine reports she has the Pendleton raffle blanket. We have a new banner that meets the size requirement

for hanging on the 13th Avenue fairgrounds fence and Bob and I plan to put it up early.

Set-up is Friday the 16th from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m., the biggest jobs to start are hanging a banner on the building front and the raffle blanket inside and hauling in a bunch of supplies from my and Bob's vehicles. It's amazing how much stuff it takes to do this show, worse than going to PPR. Member drop-ins are welcome at any time; remember the building may not be warm but we will have hot coffee and cookies and an oil heater to hug until the staff takes pity on us and turns on the heat.
