I am a relative newcomer to the genealogy world, but I have been bitten by the bug. I have been able to learn about relatives I never knew I had, with most of my discoveries coming from information in our wonderful local genealogy library. But for two of my family lines, I hit a wall – no matter how hard I looked, I could not find any information to document any family prior to my great-grandparents. I knew they must have lived in south Georgia or north Florida, but I could find nothing to verify my hypothesis.

Shortly after I hit my dead ends, I learned of the unique collections of the Huxford Genealogical Society Library in Homerville, Georgia. The library houses, among other information, the extensive research of Judge Folks Huxford. Many of you are familiar with the work of Judge Huxford, as published in his highly regarded “Pioneers of Wiregrass Georgia” series of books. Contained within the Huxford Library are his original handwritten notes, which he used to compile the sketches of his “Wiregrass” books and other publications. Many of his notes have never been published. Upon my visit to the Huxford Library, I was given a folder of Judge Huxford’s notes for the family surname I was researching. Almost immediately, I was able to make a connection with my family line – the missing link I had been looking for!

I have so much research to complete, and so many clues to follow, thanks to the information I was able to find at the Huxford Library and nowhere else. I can’t wait to make my next trip to Homerville. I encourage anyone who is researching Georgia and Florida genealogy to make the trip. The library attracts researchers from all over the world, and we are fortunate to have it practically in our back yard.

### GENEALOGY QUERY CORNER

1. I am seeking information about a Shepherd Williams who moved to Madison County from South Carolina in the early 1850s. He moved there with an Elian James (called Juliann in the 1880 census). Their two children were born in 1853 and 1855, and were married after 1860? Sometime before then he may have also obtained a Florida divorce from his wife Margaret (Peggy) back in South Carolina. He probably also died in Madison Co., sometime after 1880. Shepherd was mulatto and Elian was white. *Nancy Magnuson, Baltimore, MD.*
2. Charlotte A. Sullivan, daughter of O. E. Sullivan of Madison County, married Theodore H. Willard in 1877. The death date on her grave stone is 1884, but she died between 1887 and 1889. Does anyone know her death date and place?
3. Emma C. Willard, born 1839, was the daughter of Nathan P. Willard of Madison, Levy and Gadsden Counties. She married Cicero Hamilton Perry of Early Co., GA in Oct 1857. Perry died 1861, and she married James Purd Henry Brown of Clay Co., GA in Aug 1868. Does anyone know where she married Perry or Brown? Does anyone know her middle name?

### Colonial Naming Tradition

Need some hints to help solve some of your genealogical challenges? The following colonial naming traditions for children might just provide the slight clue you need:

First son was named after the father’s father;  
Second son named after the mother’s father;  
Third son named after the father;  
Fourth son named after the father’s oldest brother; and the  
Fifth son named after the father’s second oldest brother or the mother’s oldest brother.

First daughter named after the mother’s mother;  
Second daughter named after the father’s mother;  
Third daughter named after the mother;  
Fourth daughter named after the mother’s oldest sister; F  
ifth daughter named after the mother’s second oldest brother or father’s oldest sister.

Middle names were often based on the mother’s maiden name or the surname of close friends. *[Compiled from numerous genealogical sources]*

## So, just exactly who was Sis Hopkins?

Have you ever heard of Sis Hopkins? Or the Sis Hopkins Inn in Madison, FL? We stumbled upon a postcard in Elmer's Genealogical Library (see picture on front cover). The postmark on the card was unreadable and it became a challenging search to learn more about Madison's Miss Sis Hopkins. After much research we located the newspaper article that appears on the inside cover of this issue. It described her inn and told us a little about her. The article was printed February 2, 1934 in the Quitman Free Press and one week later in the Madison Enterprise Recorder. But what else did we learn about Miss Hopkins?

Miss Ethel L. Hopkins was born in September 1879 in Henderson, KY, the daughter of John T. and Elizabeth Hopkins. In the early 1900s, she was living in Audubon Village, Henderson, Kentucky, with her parents and brothers, John T. and William Hopkins. By the 1920 US Census, she and her parents have moved to Madison. In 1922 her mother, Elizabeth, passed away and was buried in Oak Ridge Cemetery, Section C2. The 1930 US Census confirms this as it shows her still living in Madison with her father and brother, John T. Hopkins, Jr. Her father, John passed away in 1938 and was laid to rest beside his wife. On January 17, 1948, Ethel's brother, John, passed away and also was buried in the family plot. Miss Hopkins passed away February 3, 1961 in the Madison County Memorial Hospital following an illness that lasted about a year. She was 81 years old and had lived in Madison for more than 40 years, where she was noted as an artist. Her art studios furnished much of the beautiful hand painted china found in Madison homes and her paintings of the camellia for which Madison is noted, and the magnolia flower are unexcelled. For many years she was the owner-operator of the "Sis" Hopkins Inn and was known for her gracious hospitality with a large traveling clientele. Of her it could truthfully be said "She looked well to the ways of her household, and eateth not the bread of idleness." Miss Hopkins was a member of the Madison Presbyterian church, and was beloved by all who knew her. She was laid to rest in the family lot in Oak Ridge Cemetery near her parents and brother. She was survived by one nephew, John T. Hopkins, III of Jacksonville; three nieces, Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Case of Memphis, TN, and Mrs. Ethel Edwards and Miss Elizabeth Hopkins of Washington, DC. Serving as pallbearers were: Walter Cooper, Jr., S. A. Smith, Julian Gibson, Donald Dickinson, Frank Cantley, B. G. Wyche, Azel Zipperer and Gordon Ashley. Mr. and Mrs. John T. Hopkins, III, of Jacksonville, Mr. and Mrs. Harold DeLong of Gainesville, GA, and Mr. and Mrs. Jack White of Live Oak were among the out of town relatives and friends attending the service. *[Extracted from the 1900 US Census, Lower Henderson, Henderson, KY; 1920 US Census, Madison, Madison, FL; 1930 US Census, Madison, FL; 1945 Florida State Census; and Madison County Enterprise Recorder, 10 Feb 1961]*

## Mrs. Edna Cain Daniel

As you can tell from the article on the Sis Hopkins Inn, Mrs. Edna Cain Daniel was a major leading woman of Quitman, Georgia. She was the editor and publisher of the Quitman Free Press and a well known Georgia journalist. Mrs. Daniel, the former Miss Edna Cain, was a native of Chatooga County, GA, the daughter of Armanda Johnson and John Wilson Cain. Her father was a well known newspaper man and the family moved to Quitman sometime near 1905, when Mr. Cain became publisher of the Quitman Free Press, a paper founded in 1876 by Henry M. McIntosh. Following the death of her father, she and her brother, John M. Cain, edited and published the Free Press, she later buying out her brother's interest. Mrs. Daniel's husband, Royal Daniel, served as publisher of the paper from 1914 until his death in June of 1939. She passed away at the Brooks County Hospital, Thursday, February 21, 1957 after having been challenged with declining health for several years. Her funeral services were held from her home in Pinetop, GA and she was laid to rest at Oak Hill Cemetery, Quitman, GA beside her husband, Royal who had died 18 years earlier.

Mrs. Daniel was well known in the field of southern journalism and in her earlier years had been a feature writer with the old New York Word, occupying a desk near Mr. O. O. McIntyre, Albert Peyson Terhune and other journalism greats. She spent a year in Puerto Rico doing special features for New York papers and served as a columnist for the Atlanta Journal. For more than 50 years she promoted and worked for community development on a wide scale, everything from abolishing the cows from the streets to beautifying the parks. She was a charter member of the Quitman Woman's Club, serving as president, and a charter member of the Quitman Garden Club. Her civic appointments ranged from serving on the Brooks County Board of Health to Chairman of the Park Commission in its formative days. In 1944 Time Magazine carried an article about her and her weekly paper, reciting some of her early crusades and tracing the history of her journalistic career. In April 1956 she earned the coveted Brenda award from the Atlanta Chapter of Theta Sigma Phi, for "fearless journalism," she being the only newspaper woman in Georgia to have received the award. *[Extracted from Quitman Free Press, 28 Feb 1957; various census documents; and other documents located in Elmer's Genealogical Library]*

Private **Allen A. Coker** (b. 1845 or 1843 Irwin Co. GA) enlisted 4/1/62 at Taylor and deserted 5/25/62 at Station #5, P & G RR. He served in his brother's band of deserters before reenlisting 4/10/64 in Company D, 2nd Florida (US) Cavalry in Taylor Co. as a refugee from the Confederacy. He deserted 11/9/64 at Cedar Key and voluntarily returned to duty 4/18/65. He died of measles on the road from Levyville to Station #4 7/3/65. He was 5'7", black eyes, brown hair & fair skin. Occupation: Farmer. See James Coker (below). (p. 783)

Private **James Coker** (b. 1831) and his brothers, L. Allen and William, enlisted 4/1/62 at Taylor and deserted 5/25/62 at Station #5, P & G RR. James raised a company of deserters and his brothers Allen and William served in it until they joined the 2nd Florida Cavalry. James never joined the 2nd Florida Cavalry but remained captain of deserters. Father: Jonathan; Mother: Nancy. (p. 783)

Private **William Peyton Coker** (b. 1834 or 1844 in Irwin Co. GA) enlisted 4/1/62 at Taylor and deserted 5/25/62 at Station #5, P&G RR. He served in his brother's band of deserters before reenlisting 4/10/64 in Company D, 2nd Florida (US) Cavalry in Taylor Co. as a refugee from the Confederacy and died of typhoid 8/5/64 at Cedar Key. He was 5'11", blue eyes, light hair & fair skin. Occupation: farmer. See James Coker (above). (p. 783)

Private **David Conine** (b. 1845) enlisted 4/1/62 at Madison. He was slightly wounded 5/3/63 at Chancellorsville. He was captured 7/2/63 at Gettysburg and released on oath 6/10/65 from Fort Delaware prison. He was 5'8", hazel eyes, light skin & hair. His name appeared on a petition to President Lincoln dated 6/1/65 stating he was forced into service. (p. 783)

Private **Whit W. Conine** (b. 1844) enlisted 4/1/62 at Madison. He was left sick on road near Manassas 8/31/62 and admitted 9/26/62 to a Confederate Hospital, Culpepper (INCORRECT - IT IS CULPEPER) VA. He died of disease sometime after then. I believe he died in Richmond and was buried in Oakwood Cemetery, Richmond. (p. 783)

Private **J. M. Curry** enlisted 5/8/62 at Station #5, P&G RR but deserted 5/12/62. (p. 783)

Private **John A. Elixson** enlisted 5/8/62 at Station #5, P & G RR and transferred to Company F, 8th Florida Infantry later that month. He was wounded 4/10/64 and lost his big left toe. He was furloughed 5/28/64 from a Farmville VA hospital. He was present on the last roll. (p. 784)

Private **Rueben S. Fletcher** (b. 1826; m. Martha 1/20/43; d. 5/4/75 Hamilton Co.) enlisted 4/1/62 at Taylor and deserted 5/10/62. He reenlisted 8/1/64 in Company D, 1st Florida Reserves at Lafayette. He was present on the last roll and was paroled 5/16/65 at Madison. He was 5', dark skin & eyes, grey hair. His wife received a Florida pension for his service in this company. (p. 784)

Private **John Futch** lived in Houston and enlisted 5/8/62 at Station #5, P&G RR. He was AWOL since 10/15/63 and dropped after June 1864. (p. 784)

Private **J. H. Grant** enlisted 5/8/62 at Station #5, P&G RR and deserted 5/10/62. (p. 785)

Private **Elisha Hall** (b. 2/14/31 Hamilton Co.; d 6/6/1920 buried in Union Cemetery, O'Brien, Suwannee Co.) enlisted 4/1/62 at Madison and deserted 6/16/62. He reenlisted 8/2/62 in Company C, 2nd Florida Battalion at Lake City. He was captured on picket 9/10/64 at Petersburg and released on oath 6/30/65 from Point Lookout prison. He was 5'11", grey eyes, light skin, brown hair; residence: Suwannee Co.) (p. 785)

Private **W. J. Herrington** enlisted 5/8/62 at Station #5, P&G RR and deserted 6/16/62. (p. 785)

Private **Sheppard James Hodges** (b. 2/7/35 Bullock Co. GA; m. Mary Susan Sealey 2/7/66; d. 10/18/1911 buried in Volusia Co.) lived in Lake City and enlisted 5/8/62 at Station #5, P&G RR. He was captured 4/6/65 at Farmville VA and released on oath 6/24/65 at Newport News VA. He was 5'7", black eyes, dark hair & skin. (p. 785)

Private **D. C. Holtsclaw** (b. 1815) enlisted 4/1/62 at Madison and deserted 6/16/62. (p. 785)

Private **John Jones** (b. 1839) enlisted 4/1/62 at Madison and died 6/5/62. (p. 785)

Private **O. D. Jones** enlisted 5/8/62 at Station #5, P&G RR and was discharged 5/9/62 after substituting **I. Wynn**. (p. 785)

Private **James W. Keen** (b. 1831 Columbia Co, GA) lived in Lafayette Co. in 1860. He enlisted 5/8/62 at Station #5, P&G RR and deserted at Camp Leon 6/30/62. He was a member of William White's band then reenlisted 5/20/64 in Company G, 2nd Florida (US) Cavalry at Cedar Key as a refugee from the Confederacy and was appointed Sgt 11/3/64. He transferred to Company D 2/2/65 as Sgt and was appointed 1st Sgt 5/1/65. He was furloughed 9/28/65 and mustered out 11/29/65 at Tallahassee. He was 5'10", blue eyes, light hair & fair skin. Occupation: farmer. (p. 785)

Private **A. J. Lisbe** (b. 1828) enlisted 4/1/62 at Madison and deserted 6/16/62. (p. 786)

Private **John H. Long** (b. 1844) enlisted 4/1/62 at Madison and died 10/3/62 at Charity Hospital, Gordonsville VA. He was buried in a local Confederate Cemetery. (p. 786)

Private **Pat Newman** (b. 1831) buried in Midway Baptist Church Cemetery, Madison Co. enlisted 4/1/62 at Madison and was discharged 5/11/62. (p. 787). Private **Jacob Pickles** (b. 1843) enlisted 4/1/62 at Madison and deserted 7/16/62. He returned 10/10/64 and was paroled at Lynchburg VA in April 1865. He may have reenlisted in Company B, 10th Florida Infantry during his absence in 1864. (p. 787)

Private **N. M. Redding** enlisted 5/8/62 at Station #5, P&G RR and was elected 3rd Lt 11/26/62. He was mortally wounded in the left hip May 1864 and died 5/28/64 at General Hospital #4, Richmond. (p. 787)

Private **William Sullivan** (b. 1846 Madison Co.) enlisted 4/1/62 at Madison as a Musician and was discharged 10/15/62. He was 4'5", light skin & hair, blue eyes, occupation: student. (p. 787)

Private **Eli Triplett** enlisted 5/8/62 at Station #5, P&G RR and deserted 7/18/62 at Thomasville. He may have reenlisted in Company F, 5th Florida Cavalry. (p. 788)

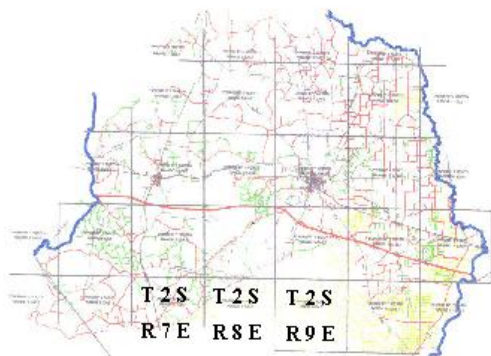

### Common Mistakes in Genealogy Research

1. Not using such tools as family group sheets and pedigree charts;
2. Not using the appropriate maps that reflect the time your ancestors were living in a specific location (especially important to note the changing counties);
3. Not understanding the time and history of the area you are researching;
4. Gathering information on everyone with the specific surname, unless it is a very uncommon one;
5. Not making photocopies and documenting your sources—it may be the last time you find the information;
6. Not organizing your records in a manner that works well for you;
7. Assuming your surname is NEVER spelled a different way;
8. Not using primary sources such as land, probate, and county records, but instead depending upon information gathered by others—they could be very wrong;
9. Not contacting other family members for assistance—they may very well have exactly the information and source that you need; and
10. Not looking for others who are researching your same line. Whether you contact others through the web or other family members—don't forget that there are others out there searching and maybe they are looking for what you already have.
11. Deciding it is too difficult to continue—try another route, ask for help from someone with more experience, or come visit your favorite genealogy society and ask for their help. Just don't give up hunting that elusive family member! *[Compiled from numerous genealogical sources]*

### What do Census Documents Tell US?

Census documents are great things when it comes to our research but they can also be quite confusing if you don't understand the different material gathered in the different censuses. A careful look at the different census documents shows the different information available. Let's take a short look at some of the differences:

- ✓ 1790 Census—shows name of head of household; number of free white males 16 and up; number free white males under 16; number of free white females; number of slaves; and number of other persons.
- ✓ 1800 Census—shows name of head of household, number of free white males (broken down by age groups); number of free white females (broken down by age groups); number of other free persons; and number of slaves.
- ✓ 1810 Census—name of head of family; number of free white males (broken down by age groups); number of free white females (broken down by age groups); number of other free persons; and number of slaves.
- ✓ 1820 Census—shows name of head of household; number of free whites (broken down by male (into age groups) and female (into age groups); number of foreigners not naturalized; number of persons engaged in agriculture, commerce or manufacture; number of slaves (broken down by males (into age groups) and females (into age groups); number of free colored (broken down by males (into age groups) and females (into age groups); and number of all other persons.
- ✓ 1830 Census—shows name of head of household; number of free white persons (broken down by males and females (each further broken down into age groups); number of free colored persons (broken down by males and females (each broken down into age groups); total number of persons in household; number of slaves (broken down by male and female (each broken down into age groups); number of white persons who are deaf and dumb (broken down into age groups), blind, or aliens.
- ✓ 1840 Census—shows name of head of household; number of free white persons (broken down by males and females (each further broken down into age groups); number of free colored persons (broken down by males and females (each broken down into age groups); total number of persons in household; number of slaves (broken down by male and female (each broken down into age groups); number of white persons who are deaf and dumb (broken down into age groups), blind, or aliens; name and age of Revolutionary War/military pensioners.
- ✓ 1850 Census—first census attempting to gather data on all living within a household; shows name of person; description of person (age, sex, and color); occupation; value of real estate owned; birthplace; if married within year; if attended school; if cannot read or write; and whether deaf and dumb, blind, insane, idiotic, pauper or convict.

- ✓ 1880 Census—shows name of person; color; sex; age; month of birth if born within the year; relationship to head of household; civil condition (single, married or widowed/div); month of marriage if married within the year; occupation (profession or trade and months unemployed); health issues (sickness/disability, blind, deaf or dumb, idiotic, insane, or crippled); education (attended school, cannot read, and cannot write) birthplace of self, father and mother. *[Extracted from various genealogical sources]*
