- As part of our Inward Missions, a few meals were prepared for some of our members.

Plans are being finalized for a home cooked meal for the families staying at the SECU House in WS, collecting food for the Baptist Children's Home Annual Food Roundup, additional visits to H.O.P.E (Help our People Eat) to make bagged lunches and package fresh vegetables are being scheduled and our Annual Ladies Fellowship Tea.

Every lady in our church is invited to join us for our next meeting on **Wednesday, April 3**rd. I so often hear "why so many projects & how do you all do it". Believe me, it happens because of our faith in Christ and the love and support of the members of UCBC.
