Dear Sunrise Community,

At Sunrise, November is a time for reflection. The students discussed what it means to be thankful, and the classroom activities were focused on helping and giving to others in our school and helping members of our community.



During the past several weeks the teachers spent a great deal of time planning and preparing for the students' **Sharing Time**.

Sharing Time was held on the Tuesday before our Thanksgiving break, and this is a time when the classrooms enjoy being with one another. As part of this sharing process, the Classroom A students made a turkey for their classmates in Classroom B and the Classroom B students created beautiful placemats for their classmates in Classroom A. During Sharing time, both classrooms enjoyed singing songs, listening to stories, and eating (or sampling) cornbread, dried fruit, and homemade applesauce that was made in the afternoon kindergarten class the day before. Upcoming Student Jan Brett-themed event on Saturday, December 9th from 9am until noon.

(with an inclement weather date of December 16th.)

Former Head of School, Karen Roeber, and I plan to hold a December Jan Brett themed event for students. You may have heard the phrase "two heads are better than one" – this definitely applies to Karen and me.

This will be a 3-hour student only program on Saturday, December 9th from 9am – 12pm with an inclement weather date of the 16th. The cost is \$50 per student.

The front room will have several stations set up with activities, crafts, cookie decorating, healthy snack station, and a corresponding book will be read by a volunteer and/or staff member. Each station will highlight one of my favorite authors – Jan Brett!

Outdoor Recess Weather Policy

Sunrise follows the Department of Early Education and Care's weather policy. If the outside temperature is at least 15 degrees or higher and it is not raining/sleeting, the children play outdoors. The wind chill factor determines our outdoor play and the length of time we spend outdoors. This also means if the wind chill factor is below 15 degrees, we are not able to play outdoors at all.

As temperatures vary throughout the day, we request that you send the following items daily: hat, mittens or gloves, warm footwear, and a warm jacket. Please label all your child's outdoor items to ensure that any misplaced items get returned to its owner. Once the snow is here, please send in either snow pants or a snowsuit for your child to wear in the snow. If you don't already have snowpants or a snowsuit for your child, now is the time to search/buy one. These items are often difficult to find in stores!

When there is snow on the ground and items get wet/messy, your child's snow gear will be sent home each day to ensure these items get dried. We are not able to leave snow gear items at school as most of the children will be wearing their snow gear home from the playground. We appreciate your cooperation with this in advance. If you have a large bag with handles that holds your child's snow pants, please also label the bag with your child's name.

The New Pizza Session begins January 5th and runs through March 29th, 2024 for students who eat lunch at school. The remaining pizza dates for the current session are December 8th and 15th. Session 2 pizza forms will be available at the Parent Conferences.

Re-enrollment Period and Process for Current Families from January 2nd – January 19th

Once school is back in session in January, all Sunrise families will receive important re-enrollment information via email. This email will contain a letter providing updated tuition rates for the 2024 - 2025 academic year and options, along with a returning student application form (fillable online). To secure your child's preschool or kindergarten space for September 2024, please complete the returning student application form no later than January 19th – there is no application fee for re-enrollment of current students, but it is important to secure your child's space before the new student enrollment begins on January 20th. If you will need an application for a younger child, please let me know as this form is slightly different. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions.

Sunrise Open House Events for new prospective families

Please help promote next year's enrollment by sharing our Open House information with your coworkers, neighbors, family, and friends. The dates are Saturday, January 20th & Saturday, February 3rd. The time for either date is from 11am-1pm. Sunrise's Parent Representatives will be present for these events to help meet new families and provide a parent's perspective view!

Classroom A Newsletter November 2023

Dear Classroom A families,

This month our classroom was busy getting ready to celebrate the Harvest and the many upcoming celebrations! As part of the **Grace and Courtesy** curriculum, and in preparation for Sharing Day, our class was very interested in learning about place setting in **Practical Life**. The children worked hard to make footprint turkeys for our friends in Classroom B on Sharing Day. It was a fun project and the children enjoyed decorating with feathers, sequence, and seasonal stickers! On Sharing Day, our classroom sang a song for Classroom B that we worked on the entire month called *I'm Thankful* by Frank Leto. The children did a beautiful job singing along with the music!

This month in **Science**, our classroom began learning about turkeys!
The children enjoyed using the 3-part cards to match the labels and pictures of the parts of a turkey.
They practiced identifying beginning, middle, and ending sounds with a turkey work in the **Language** area and worked on pincer grip by pin punching a turkey!
Our classroom read stories and laughed together while singing the Frank Leto song










We also learned about the parts of a tree.
The children used the 3-part matching material to learn about the different tree parts and then when they learned them all, they created their own Parts of a Tree booklet.

In **Kindergarten Class**, we learned how to make apple sauce! We researched a recipe, wrote out our own recipe, and made a list of ingredients. Before Sharing Day, we peeled and sliced apples to put into a crockpot and added sugar and cinnamon. On Sharing Day, the apple sauce was served to our classroom friends.


In the **Sensorial Area** of our environment, we are learning about Geometric Solids.

Famous Artist of the month - Wassily Kandinsky


Kandinsky "Several Circles"
