September and Street Fair have arrived. Actually, Street Fair got an early start this year but your Post and Legion Family stand ready. Like a well oiled machine, the grill is staffed, the clubroom team has it covered and the Riders are chomping at the bit to get out in the heat and park those cars. This is a maximum effort weekend and your Post is up to the task. The Street Fair is our major fundraiser of the year with our parking lots jam packed and our clubroom, standing room only. This isn't just about the fundraising, it isn't about the entertainment or the adult refreshments, this is a major opportunity to show our community that we are here and ready to serve our Veterans and our community. Every year, we gain new members, refresh old acquaintances and share referrals for services for our community of Vets. The Street Fair is THAT important.

On a more serious note, let's talk about parking at the Post during the Street Fair. Beginning Friday afternoon (8/30) and running through Sunday evening (9/1), the North parking lot will transition to exclusively paid parking. Parking will be \$10 for Fair visitors and \$50 for Fair Vendors (all day parking). The South lot will be reserved for Post 132 members and Post 132 Legion Family Unit members (Aux, SAL, ALR, UMA-VA, AVU) with a valid membership card for a unit at the Orange 132 Post. A valid card will display an expiration date of 12/31/2024. During the mornings on Saturday and Sunday, the Riders will rent available spaces in the South lot as overflow. What if you don't have a valid card with an expiration date of 12/31/2024 or later? See your membership coordinator for your family unit. Please know that I have been working my fingers off to get cards in the mail for the Legionnaires. You can also go into the National web page and print your own card. It doesn't have to be in color, it doesn't have to be laminated, it just needs to have an expiration date of 12/31/2024.

ARTIFACTS FROM THE CURATOR'S CORNER

This month's "Artifact from our Museum" is actually a collection of four (4) chronologically developed weapons of mass destruction. They are all made of metal and weigh between one pound and three pounds. They are grenades.

The first grenades, deployed against American Forces, were by the British Army. Soldiers known as "Grenadiers" held round, hollow iron balls filled with gunpowder. Officers, known as "Fusiliers" placed a fuse in each "grenade" and when the soldier was ready to throw his grenade, the officer would light the fuse and give the order: "Throw." These early weapons did not work well in rain or snow and had to be used very close to the enemy.

By the American Civil War we had developed our own grenade which could be deployed independently of another person. The Union Army issued these grenades from 1861-1862. After 1862, and until the end of the war in 1865, these grenades were not functional and therefore ceased in production. This weapon did not work well be-



cause the "mercury cap" placed on the front of the device had to hit something hard to make it explode. Since most fighting was done in grassy fields and woods, these grenades merely hit the ground and rolled away when thrown.

Our first truly reliable grenade was developed and used in World War I. It was a simple device with a "pin," "spoon," and a "fuse" attached to a metal object with 40 square projectiles, resembling to many, and getting the nickname: "Pineapple."

Around 1900 when countries were developing grenades, all but England and the US produced grenades with handles on them allowing them to be thrown a greatest distance but not with true accuracy. The US Government decided that all young boys and men played baseball and knew how to throw with accuracy, so no handles or "sticks" were part of our weapon.

The "Pineapple" grenade was deployed during WWI, WWII and Korea. By the time of Vietnam we had developed a smaller, round grenade that could be thrown farther and with greater accuracy. We use the same style grenade today and have added many others to our arsenal: Smoke, Flashbang, Flair, Sonic and Incendiary.

Our museum is fortunate to have examples of all of these grenades deployed over our nation's 250 year military history. Stop by and have a look. Even though they won't explode anymore, you don't want to drop one on your foot!


