On Election Day get out and vote your choice (*)

Since Natonal AARP launched <u>You've Earned a Say</u> in March, more than 2 million people have joined this national conversation about the future of Social Security and Medicare. What's clear is that people 50-plus from all parts of the country feel great economic anxiety. A major drive of this anxiety is concern over retirement security. Not surprisingly, they believe that Social Security and Medicare have become even more important for their future and for future generations.

Call to Action

To find out where the candidates stand on the future of Medicare and Social Security, and to tell them where you stand on keeping these programs strong, visit www.earnedasay.org.

Voters 50-plus recognize that both Social Security and Medicare face financial challenges and believe that the next president and Congress will need to make changes to strengthen these programs in order to protect the retirement security of future generations. If we act now, we can make reasonable adjustments. But the longer we wait, the larger and more drastic the adjustments will need to be. Voters 50-plus believe that both political parties will have to work together to find a solution.

Yet, many 50-plus voters feel frustrated because they don't feel they know where the candidates stand on strengthening Social Security and Medicare and other important issues. And, in fact, they tell us that the candidates have done a poor job explaining their plans for addressing these priority issues.

So, we posed three questions:

- 1. How would you protect Social Security for older Americans today and strengthen it for future generations?
- 2. How would you put Medicare on stronger financial ground and protect beneficiaries today and in the future from the burden of rising health care costs?
- 3. How would you help Americans build a financial nest egg for their retirement?

After paying into Social Security and Medicare throughout your working life, you've earned a say about their future. You also should know where the presidential and congressional candidates stand. I urge you to read the 2012 AARP Presidential Voters' Guide in the autumn issue of AARP The Magazine or online at www.arnedasay.org.

Decide for yourself which candidate best reflects your values and views. Then on Election Day, get out and vote your choice.
