In this year leading up to the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, we are joining with other congregations throughout the ELCA in re-examining Martin Luther's Small Catechism during the season of Lent. Join us for discussions on Sunday mornings in the choir room at 9:15 a.m. We will also be addressing the different Components of the Small Catechism each week in worship as noted below.

March 5 - Ten Commandments

March 12 - Apostles' Creed

March 19 - Lord's Prayer

March 26 - Holy Baptism

April 2 - Holy Communion

Feel free to bring your own Small Catechism from home or use some from church. You can download a free Small Catechism application for your smart phone from Augsburg Fortress with different tools or just for handy reference.

MID-WEEK LENTEN MEALS & WORSHIP BEGIN ON WEDNESDAY, MARCH 8

In the helter-skelter of our busy lives, come to church for a mid-week break during Lent. Take some time to slow down and attend to your spiritual well-being. We will have meals beginning at 5:30 p.m. offered by different church groups (as noted below). During the meal time, we will have some suggested conversation questions for discussion around your table that connect with our Lenten devotional as well as Stations of the Cross placemats to color as you eat and discuss.

After meal time, come to the sanctuary for our mid-week Lenten worship service at 6:30 p.m. We will be using Holden Evening Prayer, which will be led on guitar by Dawn Young and Yvonne Riske. We will hear the Scripture lessons as assigned for the previous Sunday with questions / comments for self reflection and meditation.



I don't know if I've mentioned it or not, but I'm a bit of a Disney fan for various reasons. One reason is that the movies are usually full of great music and the Disney version of Pocahontas falls in this category. One of the

songs found therein is called "Just Around the Riverbend" and it starts off with Pocahontas singing "What I love most about rivers is / You can't step in the same river twice / The water's always changing, always flowing." There's so much truth and depth in that lyric and the whole song, in my opinion. And it is quite pertinent to our life together at this time. I'm excited as we are boldly stepping into the Missional River. We have mentioned this in passing for a couple months in different ways, but



I imagine many of you are wondering what it is all about. I and a small group of church members just attended our first learning seminar for the Missional River, which is really a journey.

Please understand that this is NOT a program, but a journey. It is different for every congregation that participates because as the song states, "You can't step in the same river twice". Each church on this journey is stepping into the river at a different place, with different contexts and different people and so the outcomes will be different. This is an opportunity to deepen our spirituality. This Missional River journey is heavily focused on listening (to each other, to the congregation, to the community and most of all to God). It involves intentional periods of action, but more importantly reflection. Our American culture is all based on action with



little reflection. And yet research shows that reflection is where learning happens. By the time you read this, we will have formed our Missional River team and will soon begin meeting. One of the major first steps we will need to do is have as many of you as possible complete a congregational assessment. This will help serve as a benchmark to see where we as a congregation are currently at in a variety of categories. So watch for more information to come on that.

One of the main messages in all of this is that we, as the church, are about relationships (not that this is a news flash or anything). As we know, relationships are important for all of us because God created us to be in community with one another and with God. "We have a remarkable God! But what does it look like to be a church that worships a remarkable God" and does so through our relationships? We will investigate this and so much more in the time to come. On this journey, we will be listening to each other and to God to see what God has in store for us and where we think God wants us to go.

No matter what and no matter where the journey takes us, we know God goes with us. A great Bible verse (that I've shared before) which speaks to this comes from Jeremiah 29:11. "For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." I look forward to seeing what comes of our journey together as we step in the river.
