A Warrior for Christ Faces Many Dangers

To fight for a just cause is a noble task, but many dangers face the warrior of Christ. In a fallen world where injustice and depravity, corruption and misplaced morals are so common, our great Captain won His victory on a Cross. **Rambo Syndrome** – Zeal for the Lord is a virtue, and born of this zeal, one may want to defend against any possible threat. But the opposition to Christ's mission in the world is legion, so we each run the risk of trying to defend every front alone, forgetting that we fight alongside brothers and sisters, angels and saints. If I forget that I am only one foot soldier in the army of Christ, I will find myself exhausted from the constant battle. I can also be tempted to think that letting an issue go unfought means conceding that issue. This danger of becoming the man who always picks a fight can be countered with prudential tact and discretion, recognizing that leaving an issue unfought by no means amounts to conceding.

Friendly Fire - The one who always fights, forgetting that he is among the myriads of hosts of God, also runs the risk of getting "trigger happy." Perhaps we get nervous or impatient with the way another person in the Church defends an issue. Perhaps they are simply wrong about a small issue. Whatever the reason, we attack them for this perceived error or insufficient zeal.

This reaction helps no one.

Helping them in the fight or correcting them in private leads to growth and understanding and strengthens the Body of Christ. If they do not listen, there are two possibilities: they see something that you missed and they are in fact correct to act as they did, or they are wrong to not listen to you. Jesus Himself gave ways to deal with an erring brother, and none of them include denouncing him outside of the assembly (see Mt 18:15-17 or Lk 17:3-4).

Jaded Warrior - For the seasoned campaigner who has, perhaps, gotten tired of always fighting an uphill battle, it can be easy to forget that Christ's battle was also an uphill battle, up the Hill of Calvary. To forget this truth, the truth that victory lies in the Cross at the summit of Calvary, can easily lead the campaigner to cede to the

culture of negativity, complaining about all the issues without proposing a solution or at least complaining about all the issues and never mentioning the good. Yes, there are issues: we live in a fallen world that is not paradise. Yes, we should strive for perfection. But for there to be recognizable issues, there must first be a clear good in which the issues can be recognized.

The remedy, then? Focus on the good, on the potential that God created in each person, and encourage them to greatness. Do not give in to negativity. So with this in mind, fight on, warrior of God! Fight the good fight, and finish the race in the strength of Christ, to His glory and your unending joy.

Un Soldado de Cristo enfrenta muchos peligros

Pelear por una causa justa es una causa noble, pero se enfrentan con muchos peligros los soldados de Cristo. En un mundo caído donde la injusticia y la depravación, corrupción y moral torcida son tan comunes, nuestro gran Capitán gana Su Victoria en una cruz. **El Síndrome de Rambo**- Celos por el Señor es una virtud, y nacido de este celo, uno quisiera defender en contra de cualquier amenaza posible. Pero la oposición a la Misión de Cristo es una legión, así es que cada uno de nosotros corre el riesgo de tratar de defender cada fuerte solo. Olvidándose que peleamos al lado de hermanos y hermanas, ángeles y santos. Si se me olvida que yo soy un soldado raso en el ejército de Cristo, me encontrarte cansado a causa de las batallas constantes. También puedo ser tentado en pensar que dejar que un asunto se pase sin pelear significa que consentimos ese asunto. Este peligro de volverse un hombre que siempre empieza las peleas puede ser confrontado con un acto prudente y con la discreción, reconociendo que dejar un asunto sin pelear no significa que estamos consintiendo. **Fuego Amigable**- El que siempre pelea, se olvida que él está entre millares de ejércitos de Dios, También corre el riesgo de sentirse "disparador feliz." Tal vez nos ponemos nerviosos o impacientes con la manera en que otra persona en la iglesia defiende un asunto. Tal vez ellos están simplemente equivocados acerca de un asunto pequeño. Cualquiera que fuera la razón, los atacamos por su error o por su celo insuficiente. Esta reacción no ayuda a nadie.

Ayudándoles en la lucha o corrigiéndolos en privado conduce al crecimiento y entendimiento y fortalece el Cuerpo de Cristo. Si ellos no escuchan, hay dos posibilidades: Ellos ven algo que tú no vez y ellos de hecho tienen razón en actuar de la manera en que lo hicieron, o ellos están equivocados en no escucharte. Jesús mismo nos dio maneras en cómo tratar con un hermano equivocado, y ninguna de ellas incluye denunciarlo afuera de la asamblea (Ver Mateo 18:15-17 o Lk 17:3-4). **Soldado Desalentado** – Para los soldados que tal vez, se han cansado de siempre pelear cuesta arriba, puede ser fácil olvidar que la batalla de Cristo. También fue cuesta arriba, camino al Calvario, Olvidar esta verdad, la verdad de la Victoria descansa en la Cruz en la cima del Calvario, puede fácilmente llevar al soldado a dejarse vencer debido a la cultura de la negatividad, de quejarse de todo sin proponer ninguna solución o al menos a quejarse acerca de todos los asuntos y nunca mencionar nada Bueno. Si, hay problemas: vivimos en un mundo caído que no es el Paraíso. Si, debemos esforzarnos por lo perfecto. Pero para poder reconocer los problemas, debe primero estar claro cuales problemas deben ser reconocidos.

¿Cuál es el remedio, entonces? Enfocarse en lo Bueno, en el potencial que Dios creo en cada persona, y animarlos a ser grandes. No se dejen vencer por lo negativo.

Así es con esto en la mente, luchen, ¡soldados de Dios! Peleen la buena pelea, y terminen la carrera con la fuerza de Cristo, para Su Gloria y sus gozos interminables.

Baptismal Requirements

Baptisms for Infant to 8 yrs. are scheduled after following completed: **(1)** Registered and active parishioners for at least 1 year. **(2)** Attend Sunday Mass and live exemplary Christian lives as a model for the child to be baptized. **(3)** Parents attend a Baptism Preparation Seminar call parish to schedule your attendance. **(4)** Sponsors need to attend a Baptism class and have a letter from their parish stating they are active members, attended a Baptism classes and qualified to be godparents. **(5)** Both classes must be completed one month prior to your baptismal date. **(6)** Classes must be taken consecutively.

Sponsors for Baptism and Confirmation

- (1) Sponsors for Baptism and Confirmation need to be at least 16 yrs. old.**
- (2) They have received the sacraments of Baptism/Confirmation/First Communion, and if married, in a Catholic marriage.**
- (3) Married sponsors must provide a copy of their marriage certificate.**

If you do not register in a parish and contribute regularly (no matter how small), they will not have a record of your attendance and cannot provide a letter. This is your responsibility. Baptisms are scheduled after all requirements are fulfilled and paperwork submitted.
