

7th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C) Sunday 20 February 2022 Which Wolf Are You Feeding? Story of The Two Wolves

Dear Sacred Heart Parishioners.

I hope this weekly reflection finds you well and not too stressful because of worries, uncertainties, and hardships caused by Covid-19.

In this weekend's Gospel Jesus reminds us of the importance of mutual charity. He said to his disciples: "Be compassionate... Do not judge... Do not condemn.' What does Jesus mean with this teaching? Probably the following story can help us understand the Lord's teaching. There was an old and wise man of Cherokee culture. In his effort to teach an important life lesson to his grandson, the old man said to him: 'Son, there is a battle going on inside all of us. It is a battle between two wolves that live inside us. One wolf is angry, vengeful and violent. The other is loving, forgiving and compassionate.' 'Grandpa, which wolf will win the fight?' the grandson asked him. 'The one you feed', the grandfather answered. He went on to say that he would never like to confront or meet any kind of wolf, and most certainly he would never want to confront an angry, vengeful and violent one. A wolf like that is an extremely dangerous animal.

Each one of us has an evil wolf inside of us which is anger, envy, jealousy, sorrow, regret, greed, arrogance, self-pity, guilt, resentment, inferiority, lies, false pride, superiority, and ego. Each of us has those feelings inside us. We should not be afraid to acknowledge this reality. And how little it takes to arouse those feelings! We must keep in mind, however, that they are dangerous emotions. If we allow them to take control of our life, we could do things we would later regret. Should we feed such an evil wolf? Of course not!

As followers of Christ, the wolf that we should feed is the good one. It is joy, peace, love, hope, serenity, humility, kindness, benevolence, empathy, generosity, truth, forgiveness, compassion and faith." If we allow these to take control of our life, we will produce a harvest of kind and noble deeds. We must try to feed the good wolf and let the evil wolf starve to death. This

is more or less, I believe, what Jesus wants to tell us in the Gospel.





1 Samuel 26:2,7-9,11-13,22-23

Saul set off and went down to the wilderness of Ziph, accompanied by three thousand men chosen from Israel to search for David in the wilderness of Ziph.

In the dark David and Abishai made their way towards the force, where they found Saul lying asleep inside the camp, his spear stuck in the ground beside his head, with Abner and the troops lying round him.

Then Abishai said to David, 'Today God has put your enemy in your power; so now let me pin him to the ground with his own spear. Just one stroke! I will not need to strike him twice.' David answered Abishai, 'Do not kill him, for who can lift his hand against the Lord's anointed and be without guilt? The Lord forbid that I should raise my hand against the Lord's anointed! But now take the spear beside his head and the pitcher of water and let us go away.' David took the spear and the pitcher of water from beside Saul's head, and they made off. No one saw, no one knew, no one woke up; they were all asleep, for a deep sleep from the Lord had fallen on them.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I say this to you who are listening: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly. To the man who slaps you on one cheek, present the other cheek too; to

the man who takes your cloak from you, do not refuse your tunic. Give to everyone who asks you, and do not ask for your property back from the man who robs you. Treat others as you would like them to treat you. If you love those who love you, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what thanks can you expect? For even sinners do that much. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners lend to sinners to get back the same amount. Instead, love your enemies and do good, and lend without any hope of return. You will have a great reward, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked.

'Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate. Do not judge, and you will not be judged yourselves; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned yourselves; grant pardon, and you will be pardoned. Give, and there will be gifts for you: a full measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap; because the amount you measure out is the amount you will be given back.'
