Apologia High School Chemistry FOR CREDIT

Art Appreciation

6th - 9th grade, Teacher: Michelle Carter

Learn to understand and recognize realism, expressionism, and abstraction in art/painting. We will mix in a few spontaneous art activities to prompt expression and collaboration. No need to be an expert artist – just need an eye for learning.

Gross Anatomy

Hiding Place, The

Home Maintenance

 8^{th} - 12th grade, Teacher: Rod Hutton * can be used as $\frac{1}{2}$ credit elective

Provides all the basic information needed to repair and maintain a residential structure. It teaches skills and techniques used in carpentry, masonry, plumbing, electricity, and other building trades. Covers topics such as repair of roofs, windows, cabinets, water and waste systems, electrical wiring systems, heating and cooling systems, and insulation.

I Can Paint

1st - 3rd grade, Teacher: Lori Weaver

This class is for those who want to draw and/or paint but you just don't know how to get started. We will paint with different textures and techniques. Please bring something to cover your clothes each week.

Influential Women in History

3rd - 9th grade, Teacher: Morgan & Emma Daughtrey/co-teacher, Lori Weaver

We will study several influential women who made a difference in their countries, cultures, and the world. Students will need a notebook, folder, or binder.

Intro to Sewing & Creating Textile Products

5th - 12th grade, Teacher: Paula Culler

We will begin with basic mends such as sewing patches, replacing buttons, repairing tears, hemming, and taking in clothing. Then we will move on to hand sewing with a simple pillow project and learn some basic hand embroidery stitches.
