

GUARD YOUR WALLET

GOVERNOR NEWSOM'S PROPOSED BUDGET:

1. Seeking new funds for consumer emergency earthquake warning system.

2. Seeking \$1.75 billion for housing crisis and homeless programs and withholding local money if these needs are not met.

3. Proposing \$260 million in Medi-Cal for undocumented young adults and raising the cut off age to 26.

4. Asking to include \$100 million for aiding border immigrants and college legal assistance.

5. Asking \$1.4 billion for education including free second year community college tuition and childhood care.

6. Wants to reduce the \$257 billion unfunded retiree pensions and health care with \$13.6 billion in a pay down account.

7. Wants an increase in state spending for cannabis regulations as they are \$48.6 million short of their Prop 65 expectations. Yes, your money may all go up in smoke!

Republicans are urging the government to be more frugal and not allow this \$8 billion increase. They are asking the Governor to pay off the debt and use the money for infrastructure and to eliminate the High Speed Rail Project.

With all these increases, Prop 13 is in jeopardy and support is needed to maintain the stability and safety of the home property tax.

Cynthia's desire was to offer words of comfort, hope and promises from the Bible to support our troops and their families. Over 5,000 books were given to our troops serving overseas and abroad. Supporting America's United States Armed Forces and their families has been the greatest honor for Cynthia.

This Outreach: Words of Comfort, Hope and Promise supports all branches of the military with care packages and support for the military and their families based in the U.S. They support wounded Marines, sailors and their families at Camp Pendleton and Balboa Medical Center in San Diego. They provide support for Chaplains and military with coffee and refreshments, homecoming packages for single Marines and sailors returning from deployment. They provide Christmas parties and the Beach Bash at Camp Pendleton. They provide gifts for baby showers and military children with school supplies. They provide support for Leadership Education Seminars for military spouses and help with military families during crisis and they also help with paralyzed and blind veterans.

Cynthia's organization accomplishments include:

On June 2018, a Navy SEAL presented Cynthia and her organization with a plaque and the U.S. flag that was flown over the U.S. Central Command Crises Response Element, Sas al Nakhl, United Arab Emirates on January 30, 2018. The flag was given to her by the United States Navy Command Master Chief and the United States Navy Commander. On two different occasions Cynthia and her

team of volunteers received, in 2013 and 2007, the "President's Volunteer Service Award" for their commitment to strengthen our nation and for making a difference with their service and civic participation. Cynthia and her team received the 2013, Art of Volunteering Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton Volunteer of the Year" award. She and her team were awarded the CA 2009 Governor's Award. She also received the U.S. American flag that was flown over Afghanistan Camp Leatherneck on January 1, 2011. When a 2 Star Major General was promoted to a 3 Star General, he gave Cynthia his 2 Stars for supporting our troops during their deployment in Afghanistan. She has also been presented by the U.S. Marine Corps with the U.S. Armed Forces Spirit of (Bob) Hope Award, at a ceremony at the Pentagon in Oct. 2008, for "selfless contributions to the improvement of the quality of life for Marines and their families". The U.S. Freedom Team Salute sent Cynthia a letter and certificate in appreciation for her support to our Soldiers. Two Generals, on separate occasions, presented Cynthia with the Guadalcanal Award for exceptional service and dedication to the Marine Corps. Cynthia has been invited to speak at numerous community events as well as on radio and television broadcasts to share her military outreach and encourage the American people to support our troops.

Cynthia resides in San Clemente and will be married for 47 years in April. She is grateful to her husband, Frank, who served in the




