From the President's Desk... Loretta K. Donlon



This past March, the CNY labor community lost a long-time advocate for education. I asked Carol Sorkin to share highlights of her husband's life for this column.

I met my husband, Neal B. Sorkin, when I started teaching at Jamesville-DeWitt Middle School in the fall of 1973. He had been there since it opened in 1967. (Before that, he had taught in North

Syracuse for two years and Jamesville-DeWitt Junior High for one.) Neal often spoke fondly of the early days of the Middle School - of the excitement to learn on the part of students and teachers. He kept that enthusiasm for learning and teaching all through his life. Even in his last few months, he used his vast collection of books and DVDs to spark conversation with his aides and help some of them in their studies.

Neal's lessons in the classroom were colored by his own unique interests and experiences. He shared his love of 50's music by organizing a Fifties Day and playing with other teachers in a rock band. An alternate delegate to the 1980 and 1984 Democratic National Conventions, he ran political conventions with his students and took them to volunteer in local party headquarters. (One of the comments I hear the most now is from people wishing Neal was here to discuss politics. We can only imagine what he'd think!)

An avid consumer of news, Neal expected each student to come in every day with two news stories unrelated to sports (unless the Cleveland Indians happened to be in the playoffs!) He taught labor union arbitration by playing the bakery boss negotiating with his students in the bakers' union. Neal was proud to be among the first teachers to regularly attend Labor Council meetings and served as a GSLC trustee and director. He was gratified to receive the Bernie DeJoseph Legend Award in 2007.

Neal worked long and hard to improve the lot of teachers - from serving as JDFA President (1969-70) and OCTA President (1974-75) to serving as NYSUT's ED 7 director for twentythree years. When Neal retired from NYSUT's board in 1997, Bob Doyle, a co-founder of RC7, said "Always courteous doing battle in both good times and bad, Neal gained the admiration and respect of our Central New York Senators and Assembly members...Over the years he kept politicians accountable with such grace that 'Thank you, Neal' were the last words uttered after every session."

Neal's NYSUT colleagues became his friends for life and were with him until the very end. Their visits and calls lifted his spirits and he was happy to surprise some of them at the last OFC breakfast at the Ramada. Andy and I would like to thank you all for bringing such joy to his life and ours. ~Carol Sorkin
