We had a lively group today, mainly because our speaker was the ever-entertaining Lion Phil. He presented a PowerPoint presentation of the Camp of Champions.

This organization is the product of one man, Tim Ingram. After playing professional hockey in Canada, Tim moved to the Coachella Valley in 2006.

When the principal of his kid's primary school asked him to help motivate six kids whose attendance was low, he came up with the motivational program that is now Camp of Champions. The result of that first year, seventy kids were motivated to improve their attendance.

The program basically has three steps: he visits the school with his inflatable sports games and lets the kids play. The school staff then takes over challenging kids to improve on a problem having to do with attendance, grades, and citizenship.

After a given amount of time, those kids who achieved their goals get another free-play day and other perks, like attending the Athletes in Academic event where they can meet and hear professional athletes give motivational talks. Those of us who served hamburgers and hot dogs at the last event saw how the kids responded to them. Heartwarming to say the least!

Other programs the Camp of Champions sponsor have to do with hockey, two for kids and two for both children and adults who are disabled. One is called Sled Hockey and the other Wheelchair Hockey.

AND ONE MORE THING:

A group of friends and I went on the Desert Hot Springs Spa Tour last Thursday. For \$25.00 we were able to visit eight different resorts. Saw Tim at Two Bunch Palms selling raffle tickets.

Turns out he started the event a few years ago. The city asked him for help making people aware of the different facilities the different resorts offer.
