TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 1st APRIL 2019

1. OBJECTIVES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The objectives of the Jacaranda UK Foundation as defined in our Trust Deed are, for the public benefit, to relieve the needs of children and adults in Malawi in particular but not exclusively by providing charitable assistance to and advancing the education and training of those who are the victims of HIV/AIDS, war or natural disaster or catastrophe by making grants of money and by supporting the work of other charities and organisations furthering similar charitable purposes in this country.

From our establishment in 2015 we have focused our efforts on supporting The Jacaranda Foundation in Malawi, a Non-Governmental Organisation run by a Board of Trustees, which administers The Jacaranda School for Orphans located outside Limbe, Malawi.

Founded by Marie Da Silva in 2002, the school cares for over 400 children, 97% of whom have been orphaned by AIDS. Marie worked as a nanny in the US to fund the school initially, but now runs the school full time with her husband, Executive Director Luc Deschamps. Three of our trustees have worked at the school either as volunteers or as full-time teachers.

2. FUNDRAISING AND PERFORMANCE

During this financial year we had three main sources of funds:

- i) Regular donations from individuals
- ii) Individuals taking part in sponsored activities
- iii) Grants from other trusts and foundations

From 2015-2018 we saw a steady growth in income and grants made. Our income in this financial year declined somewhat but despite this we were able to make a grant of £30,000 to the Jacaranda Foundation, our largest grant to date. This grant was used to cover four months of salaries for primary and secondary school teachers, as well as ground staff and security guards at the school. However, we do not expect to be able to make grants at that level for the financial year 2019-20.

3. FINANCIAL REVIEW OF THE YEAR

We started the financial year with cash reserves of £29,785.02, following a large single donation received in March 2018. We were therefore able to make a grant of £30,000 to the Jacaranda Foundation in June 2018.

During the year we received total income (including Gift Aid) of £14,447.09; of this £4,489.60 is reserved for the following uses:

- £2,500 for the paying of teachers' salaries (grant from the Carmela and Ronnie Pignatelli Foundation)
- £1,000 for the purchasing of text books (grant from the Friends of Malawi Association),
- £989.60 to pay for the university fees of a Jacaranda School for Orphans graduate (individual donation)

The remaining £9,957.49 are unrestricted funds.

We incurred expenses of £540.48 and at the end of the year we had cash reserves of £13.691.63.

We have decided to continue our policy of retaining £5,000 as a working capital reserve. This policy is reviewed annually.

We anticipate total grants made in 2019/20 will not exceed £12,000.

No Trustee has ever received any payment for their duties or for any other purpose.

4. **PLANS FOR 2019/20**

We were delighted to welcome a new Trustee, Anna Harnden in 2018.

Anna brings significant fundraising expertise with her, and the we hope to use her experience to increase our income from trusts and foundations over the next financial year.
