



The 2021-2022 Living with Christ Sunday Missal is available at the Parish Office for 5.00 each. The Sunday Missal contains complete readings and Mass texts, as well as selected hymns for Sundays and feast days for the entire Church year.

ORDINARY TIME

Ordinary Time encompasses that part of the liturgical year that does not fall within the distinctive seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The Catholic Church celebrates two periods of the year as Ordinary Time: the first following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continuing until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday; the second following Pentecost Sunday until the evening before Advent.

JUNE 21 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT ALOYSIUS GONZAGA, RELIGIOUS: Aloysius Gonzaga was born in 1568. While he was still young, he began to practise prayer and penance. In 1585 he joined the Jesuits, hoping to go to the missions. Instead, in 1591 the plague broke out in Rome, and Aloysius offered himself to serve the sick and dying in the hospital. He caught the plague and died three months later. He was just 23 years old, but his zeal for God remained an inspiration and example for all. Aloysius died in 1591 and was canonized in 1726. He is a patron saint of young men.

JUNE 23 - THE SOLEMNITY OF THE NATIVITY OF SAINT JOHN THE BAPTIST, SPECIAL PATRON OF FRENCH CANADIANS: John the Baptist is commemorated as the forerunner of the Messiah. He prepares the Lord's coming not only by his preaching, but in the circumstances of his birth and of his death. The Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist is celebrated six months before the birth of Christ. With its proximity to the summer solstice, it signifies the waning of the light, while the birth of Jesus near the winter solstice marks the coming of the light. John was given his name on the occasion of his birth in accordance with an angel's instruction to his father, Zechariah. In disbelief that he and Elizabeth would have a son, Zechariah asked for a sign and was struck dumb, but in the giving of the name, his speech was restored.



<u>JUNE 24 - THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS</u>: In the devotion to the Sacred Heart, the heart of Jesus is adored as a symbol of his threefold love: human love, spiritual love, and divine love. In modern times, the image of the Sacred Heart in the home has become a sign that the love of Jesus rules over the family. The Feast of the Sacred Heart was established as a feast for the Universal Church in 1856 by Pope Pius IX. In 1899, Pope Leo XIII consecrated the world to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

<u>JUNE 24 - WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR PRIESTS:</u> Catholics worldwide are urged to pray for Priests today on the World Day of Prayer for Priests. This day, which coincides with the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, was begun by Pope (Saint) John Paul II in 2002, with the objective of having all Catholic faithful join in prayer for the sanctification of Priests. *Please set aside some time on this special day to pray for Priests throughout the world, that they may dwell 'in the heart of Jesus'.*

<u>JUNE 25 - MEMORIAL OF THE IMMACULATE HEART OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN</u> <u>MARY:</u> The devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary is closely linked with that to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Although popular devotion began in the 17th century, it was in 1805 that permission was given for a feast of the Pure Heart of Mary. In 1944 the feast was instituted in the Western Church. Since then, popes have on numerous occasions consecrated the whole world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Mary's sanctity and her love as the Mother of God are signified by her Immaculate Heart
