Child Pilot FAQs:

FYI Allen– Check in codes will be updated to match door codes. We are in the process of updating.

Q: What do I do if I accidentally made an account as a new parent?

A: Email us and we will merge or delete the extra account.

Q: What do I do if the app doesn't let me use my personal email?

A: You should log in with the email that received the invitation. If you need an invitation to a different email, please email us.

Q: How do I obtain my tax statement?

A: Go to billing and then click on tax statement.

Q: What options do I have to check in/out my child?

A: We will migrate to electronic check in soon. You will sign your child in with the 4 digit PIN or the scan the QR code from the app.

Q: What if I do not check in/out my child?

A: Signing in helps with our lunch order counts.

Q: What advantages/disadvantages are there to this app?

A: Advantages: You will be able to pay online, saving time for office staff; you will be able to immediately access your tax statement, less paper for everyone. Disadvantages: The app takes up room on your phone.

Q: What if I do not sign up for the app?

A: We will migrate the weekly lessons and photos on the app, instead of email. For infant and toddler classes, this will replace the paper daily sheet with your child's diaper changes and food intake. You can use the web version too:

DROP OFF TIME

Our toddler and primary teachers have mentioned that parents are interrupting class when dropping off after class starts. Our teachers encourage everyone to arrive before 8:30. If arriving after 8:30, drop your child off in the lobby and have your child enter the class quietly. If needed, a teacher will assist them to class.

If your child needs assistance going to class before 8:30, you may assist your child to class. Please do not have long conversations with the teacher, which distracts from supervising students. Teacher conferences are encouraged for those conversations.
