RANSOMEWARE COMING IN VIA TRUSTED EMAILS *Be cautious with links*

The most important thing you can do to avoid falling victim to phishing attacks is to not click on links within unsolicited emails. Cybercriminals constantly come up with clever, fraudulent messages that look like they're from legitimate sources *and trusted friends* and contain malicious links. Clicking these links can lead to your gadget being infected with ransomware.

That's why you need to be able to recognize a phishing scam. One thing to watch for with phishing attacks are typos, criminals are typically careless with spelling and grammar. If you receive an email or notification from a reputable company, it should not contain typos.

Have strong security software

Make sure you're using strong antivirus software on all of your gadgets. And keep them up-to-date for the best protection. This is the best way to keep your device from being infected with malware. *Yes, it will cost you, but recovering your precious documents, emails, etc will cost you thousands IF they can be recovered*

Set up two-factor authentication

Two-factor authentication means that to log in to your account, you need two ways to prove you are who you say you are. This adds an extra layer of security and should be used whenever a site makes it available.

Use unique passwords

Many people use the same password for multiple websites. This is a terrible mistake. If your credentials are stolen on one site and you use the same username and/or password on others, it's easy for the cybercriminal to get into each account.

Here are some examples of using your own name for safety: johnie: = J0hn13; janice = J@n1c3; denise = D3n1\$3.. just some thoughts. or use words, like welcome = W3lc0^^3.. very hard for people to hack .. it will take them hours, possibly days to figure out how to get in and rob you

And if you think you aren't important enough to hack, just know that when you are and can't restore your pc to before the hack, you'll be dinged for anywhere from \$300, to \$3500 or more, as it will be doubled for every day you dont come up with the money they want

Back up your critical data regularly

Backing up your critical data is an important safety precaution in the fight against ransomware.

FAKE MICROSOFT WARNINGS COSTING BILLIONS TO US AND RAINING MONEY ON THE SCAMMERS

"Microsoft Warning Alert" is a fake pop-up error message claiming that the computer is infected. ... This error message states that malicious content has been detected and, therefore, personal information (logins, passwords, banking details, etc.) is at risk.

Many of our clients also get a phone call from someone with a 'foreign accent' who, even after our client protests that they don't want to engage in whatever the person is requring, ends up being pursuaded to click on links they want to show them or give them their contact, credit card AND banking information.

Each client and/or buisness that 'fell' for this either had to pay out thousands of dollars to get their computers 'decrypted' or we were able to roll it back to the previou 'restore point' that was BEFORE their pc was hi-jacked and left useless.

WHAT IS RANSOMWARE? 'rans?m?we(?)r/ noun

a type of malicious software designed to block access to a computer system until a sum of money is paid.

"although ransomware is usually aimed at individuals, it's constntly happening in businesses as well"

You bring up your computer and "Expecting to see a Twitter feed or Facebook profile, instead you're greeted with a big red image, demanding that if you don't pay \$200 to an unknown party in the next 24-hours, everything you know and love on your computer will be erased, and gone forever.

You've allowed a stranger in and he's been able to access ALL your information: banking, credit cards, email addresses and all of your documents. How do you stop this.. if you can .. immediately1: get off the internet and 2. shut down your computer, and 3. change All od your passwords.

Then call a tech that can scan your PC and make sure they haven't installed malicious proramming or a 'key logger' that can track your every stroke.



WHAT IS THE TRADITION OF WASSAILING?

Wassailing is a very ancient custom that is rarely done today. The word 'wassail' comes from the Anglo-Saxon phrase 'waes hael', which means 'good health'. Originally, the wassail was a drink made of mulled ale, curdled cream, roasted apples, eggs, cloves, ginger, nutmeg and sugar.traditionally drunk as an integral part of wassailing, a Medieval English drinking ritual intended to ensure a good cider apple harvest the following year.

Directions

Mix apple cider, orange juice, lemon juice, pineapple juice, and sugar together in a large pot over medium-

low heat.

Place cloves and cinnamon in a tea ball; add ball to the apple cider mixture. Simmer mixture until warmed through, about 15 minutes. Serve from pot with large ladle.

Wassail dates back to the Middle Ages.

The earliest versions were warmed mead into which roasted crab apples were dropped and burst to create a drink called 'lambswool' drunk on Lammas day, still known in Shakespeare's time.[1] Later, the drink evolved to become a mulled cider made with sugar, cinnamon, ginger and nutmeg, topped with slices of toast as sops and drunk from a large communal bowl.

Modern recipes begin with a base of wine, fruit juice or mulled ale, sometimes with brandy or sherry added. Apples or oranges are often added to the mix, and some recipes also call for beaten eggs to be tempered into the drink. Great bowls turned from wood, pottery or tin often had many handles for shared drinking and highly decorated lids; antique examples can still be found in traditional pubs.

Plum Pudding

In a large bowl, combine sugar, butter, milk, eggs, molasses, salt, baking soda, baking powder, and flour; add raisins, dates, nuts, candied orange or lemon citron, apples, cinnamon, cloves, and nutmeg. Fill each greased pan 1/2 full of batter. Cover tops of pans with lids or 2 layers of aluminum foil.
