One Book One Nebraska 2021 Selection Announced: Prairie Forge

People across Nebraska are encouraged to read the work of a Nebraskan —and then talk about it with their friends and neighbors. Prairie Forge: The Extraordinary Story of the Nebraska Scrap Metal Drive of World War II by James J. Kimble is the 2021 One Book One Nebraska selection.

Prairie Forge: The Extraordinary Story of the Nebraska Scrap Metal Drive of World War II takes readers across the entire state of Nebraska during the scrap metal drive early in America's involvement in World War II. When Henry Doorly initially developed a plan to urge citizens to donate scrap metal to help with arms production, he had no idea that his plan would expand from Omaha to the entire state and then be used as a model for a national scrap drive.

2021 will mark the seventeenth year of the One Book One Nebraska reading program, sponsored by the Nebraska Center for the Book. It encourages Nebraskans across the state to read and discuss one book, chosen from books written by Nebraska authors or that have a Nebraska theme or setting. The Nebraska Center for the Book invites recommendations for One Book

One Book One Cozad 2021: One False *Move* by Alex Kava

In January 2021, the Wilson Public Library in Cozad, NE, launches their seventh One Book One Cozad program with the selection of One False Move by Alex Kava.

Nebraska author Alex Kava is probably best known for her Maggie O'Dell series. One False Move is a stand-alone title published in 2004. An international best seller, it was the One Book One Nebraska selection in 2006. Kava, who splits time living in Omaha and Florida, grew up near Silver Creek, NE. She has won the Mari Sandoz Award and the 2016 Nebraska Book Award.

One False Move is a murder-thriller loosely based on a bank robbery that took place in Norfolk, Nebraska in 2002. Even the character of Charlie Starks is a nod to the infamous killer, Charlie Starkweather, who went on a murder spree across Nebraska in 1957-1958.


Book Club Selections & Meetings Galore
