Following up on last month's Ambassador page where we discussed the benefits of NCM membership, we share the following recent item taken from the NCM website:

Member Only Section

Great things continue to be added to the member only section of the NCM website.

Currently, you can view and connect to your member benefits, view and print your membership card and download the monthly computer calendar.

Coming soon, we will be including member-only videos on various Corvette and NCM topics, special member content and information as well as many other great features.

To log on, click on the "who am I" box in the top right corner and sign in. If you haven't visited that page before, move to the second section to retrieve password information.

Corvette Assembly Plant: Production of the 2018 Corvette will cease early and the last date to order a 2018 Corvette is November 16, making it one of the shortest model years with only 9,700 Corvettes produced. The week of January 22 will be the last week of production for the 2018s with the **2019s** coming off the line starting the week of January 29, 2018. No major changes are coming for 2019; models, colours and options will carry over from 2018 with the exception of the Carbon 65 Edition which was intended only for 2018.

As reported in the *Bowling Green Daily News* in mid-October, production at the Assembly Plant starts back up on November 6. Basic colours of Black, Arctic White, Torch Red and Corvette Racing Yellow will begin rolling through the state-of-theart paint shop. Other colours, including the new 2019 Sebring Orange, will follow at a later date. The quality of the new paint won't disappoint; we can expect to see an improved paint appearance and finish out of the paint shop. That is due to changing the build process, which was designed specifically to optimize the performance of carbon fiber and other materials that are used in the Corvette body panels. The Corvette's freshly painted body panels would be among the last stops on the assembly line. Less handling = less dings.





The 2017 Corvette Racing season has ended and it's time to look forward to the 2018 season and the changes and excitement ahead!

You know the result, but let's take a brief look at the final race this season, *Petit Le Mans* held in Georgia October 4 to 7. As expected, Antonio Garcia and Jan Magnussen clinched the GT Le Mans (GTLM) Drivers title and the start of this season finale also meant the No. 3 Corvette squad earned the GTLM Team Championship. Congrats gentlemen! It's been called an absolute a team effort, and it's the second championship effort for Antonio and Jan, the first happening in the 2013 American Le Mans Series GT class.

Corvette Racing ended the season with a runner-up finish for the No. 3 Corvette at Petit with Antonio Garcia, Jan Magnussen and Mike Rockenfeller sharing the driving duties in this 10-hour endurance race. The No. 4 Corvette of Oliver Gavin, Tommy Milner and Marcel Fässler placed fourth in a stellar late-race comeback.

Rarely were the top seven GTLM cars separated by more than 30 seconds! Antonio said "Actually for a moment, I thought I had some chances for a win when an hour before I thought it was done." And Jan commented "Beating the 67 Ford out on that last stop was very important. That Ford got taken out by a prototype later on, but it was important for us to get out ahead if for nothing else than to prove a point." The rivalry between teams (and their fans) is keen!

Corvette Racing will spend a few days in November testing at the Sebring FL track in preparation for the 2018 season which opens with the Rolex 24 at Daytona on Jan. 27-28.

No. 3 ahead of Ferrari, climbing Spectator Hill



It's not *Corvette Racing*, but sports car race fans will be interested to know that Cadillac is leaving the Pirelli World Challenge Series. The team raced for the last time in September when Michael Cooper won both of the season-ending races at Sonoma Raceway in the No. 8 Cadillac ATS-V.R

Coupe. The move away from GT racing is designed to give Cadillac an opportunity to focus completely in prototype sports car racing, according to the Global Director of Product Strategy for Cadillac.



Since the team was formed in 2004, they racked up 33 wins, 121 podium finishes and 25 pole positions and competed in

332 races in 11 years with a bevy of notable drivers: Michael Cooper, Johnny O'Connell, Ricky Taylor, Jordan Taylor, Andy Pilgrim, Max Angelelli, Ron Fellows, John Heinricy, Olivier Berretta and Lawson Aschenbach. The team won PWC manufacturers' championships five times and Cadillac Racing drivers earned the World Challenge drivers' championship in 2005 with Pilgrim, and with O'Connell in 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015.

With this Cadillac announcement, the *Callaway Corvette C7 GT3-R* – a Corvette-based racer that's been run in the ADAC GT Masters (in Germany) since 2016 – is now free to participate in American racing series. The competition-spec C7 from Callaway Cars was previously barred from participating due to the GT3 exclusivity agreement the company had to sign with GM as a condition for being allowed to homologate the car, reports *Sportscar365*.

Callaway Cars will offer its Corvette C7 GT3-R to customers for use in PWC or IMSA SportsCar next year, and should be able to support up to two teams. In the IMSA series, the Callaway Corvette would find itself running alongside GM's own Corvette Racing C7.Rs. The two <u>would not</u> be direct competitors, however, as the C7.R races in the GT Le Mans class, where the Callaway C7 GT3-R would qualify for GT Daytona.




