Coaching Corner

Does your arrow fit your string??

The arrow is loaded onto the string by clipping the nock into the nocking point. The way the arrow fits onto the sting is very important, too loose and the arrow will fall off the string and too tight and it causes difficulties getting off, very similar to a pair of shoes on your feet!

Strings come in different thicknesses dependant on the materials used in its construction and the amount of strands it has. You can change the way the arrow fits the String by adjusting the amount of strands and/or the materials used. You can also add adapt the arrow by using different nocks. The more poundage you pull the more strands you must have in your string so the bigger nocks you'll need.

To test if your arrows fit your string simply clip in an arrow and rotate it around, if your arrow doesn't clip in well and has a lot of movement it's to loose. If your nock is too tight it will move the string around as it turns. What you are after it for the arrow to be able to move without moving the string but yet still have a snug fit (like your shoes).
