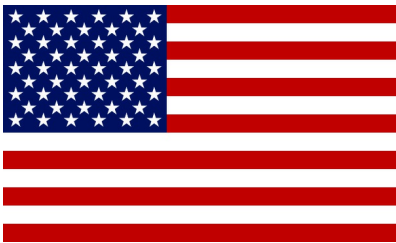

July House of the Month
257 Washington Road
The Nathaniel Foss House

The July House of the Month is a home that has recently been renovated in keeping with the integrity of the historical nature of the house.



The current owners of the house on the corner of Washington and Long John have also marked the home with a Rye Historical Society designation sign showing the name of the house.

The name which appears on the map of Rye of 1805 designates the house as owned by Nathaniel Foss, who lived here 1756-1821. His date of marriage is 1787 which is how the approximate date of the house was derived.

His son, Richard Foss, lived on the home and was married in 1819 to Eliza Shapley. His widow Eliza is shown as the occupant of the house in 1851. Another owner of the house was John Oren Foss (1830-1903). His occupation was listed as a meat cutter. At one point in time there was a giant meat cutting wheel at the house, which was since sold to a country store. There were meat hooks found still hanging in the shed, evidence of this past profession.

An older photo of the house shows that the front dormers were added much later as well as a side porch. A 1991 photo shows the house with the comment "rebuilt after the fire". You can see in the recent photo of the house that the side porch is there but the roof line has been returned to its original style typical of homes from that era. The house bears a lot of similarities to a neighboring house at 277 Washington Road, the Ebenezer Marden house from 1735 and may have been modeled on that home.
